Indenture made the Twelfth Day of
November in the year of our Lord One thousand Seven hundred & 26
Twenty six into the Twentieth Year of the reign of our Sovereign
Lord George by the grace of God of Great Brittain France & Ireland
King Defender of the faith &c. Between John Maynard of
Colleton County in the Province of South Carolina Planter of the
one part & John Wright of Charles Town in the said Province Merchant
of the other Part Witnesseth that the said John Maynard for
ye in Consideration of the sum of Two Hundred & Eight Pounds
Twelve Shillings & Eight Pence Current money of South Carolina
to him in hand with and truly paid by the said John Wright the receipt
of which is hereby acknowledged. hath bargained & sold, lett, sold, given
bargained and sold, and in plain and open Market, deliver unto the
said Wright, three Negro Slaves to wit One Negro Woman named
Daphne, & two Children named Pegg & Cupid, To have & to
hold, the said Negro Woman named Daphne, she has & to
have with their Inheritance & offspring, to the Only Proprietor
and Heir of the said John Wright, his heirs & Assignes for
ever, & the said John Maynard for himself his heirs Executors
and Administrators, the said Negro Woman Daphne, & the two
Children Pegg & Cupid unto the said John Wright his heirs
Executors & Assignes against all persons & persons
whosoever shall and with them and for ever defend by them
Prerogative Privilege Liberty Immunities that of the said
John Maynard his heirs Executors, or Administrators, or either of
them, Do and shall well and truly pay or cause to be paid
