in Body but of perfect Mind and Memory Thanks & Everlasting
Praise be unto God And Knowing that it is Decreed and appointed
for all Mankind Once to dye Do Make and Ordain this my last
Will and Testament in Manner and Form Following that is to
Say First and principally I Recommend my Soul to Almighty
God that gave it and my Body to the Earth to be Buried at the
Discretion of my Executors Hereafter named And as touching
the disposing of what Temporal Estate it hath pleased God to
Bestow upon me I Give & Dispose the same as followeth To wit
I Will that all my Debts and Funeral Charges be paid from
I Give and Bequeath unto my Beloved Son Samuel Jovin One
Negro Man named Pompey from I Give and Bequeath unto

My Beloved Son John Jovin five Negro Men named Tom,
Dick, Will, and Henry, and one Negro Woman named Hannah
and One Cyprus Boat And all my Cattle and all my household Goods
and Plantation Tools And all other my Goods & Chattels And to
discharge all Debts due to me for his own Use after my Decease from
I Give and Bequeath to my Beloved Daughter Ann Auguston Fifty
Pounds Curr. Money of the Province to be paid to her by my Son
John Jovin in Twelve Months after my Decease from I Give and
Bequeath to my Daughter Elizabeth Jovin in Case she comes or
arrives in South Carolina Fifty Pounds & Curr. Money of South
Carolina to be paid to her by my Son John Jovin in Twelve Months
after her arrival Lastly I Recommend and appoint John Tripp and
John Chaplins to be my Executors of this my last Will and
Testament after my Decease And I Do hereby Ratify and firmly
acknowledge this and no Other to be my last Will and Testament

Then Personally appeared before me Daniel Pepper Esq. one of His
Majesty's Justices of the Peace for Granville County by Virtue of a Dedimus
issued John Craig of New Windsor in Granville who made Oath
the Holy Evangelist of Almighty God that he believed the within Instrument
writing Signed by Darby McLaughlin late of this Province deceased to
be his Last Will and Testament, and that he would well and truly administer the
several Rights & Credits of the said dead and pay his Debts and
satisfy as far as his Estate will Extend & the Law shall bind him and
he will make a true & perfect Inventory and appraisement of all
the several the goods Rights & Credits of the said dead and return the
same into the Clerk's Office of the Province of South Carolina according
to the time prescribed by Law and finally that he will behave himself
as Executor by Law ought to do
