this my last Will and Testament in Manner following (viz)
I Desire I may be legally Buried by my Executors hereinafter
appointed. And I Give and Bequeath all to my beloved
Friend M^r Am. Dymon of Char. City Town Spinner, the sum of
Two Hundred Pounds current money of the said Province. And
all the rest of my Estate Real and Personal of whatsoever Nature
and Quality the same shall be found to consist of, I Give and
Bequeath the same wholly and absolutely to my dear friend
and much beloved friend M^r Archibald Young of Char. City Town
Carpenter. And hereby revoking and annulling all
former Wills and Devises by me heretofore made I Publish, make
and Declare this to be my last and Only Will and Testament. And
do constitute and Ordain my said beloved friend M^r Archibald
Young my sole Executor In Witness whereof I have hereunto
set my hand and seal this Twenty fourth day of June Anno Domini

Joseph Smith of St. Pauls Parish in Colleton County & Province of South Carolina being infirm in body but of sound mind and memory and being mindful of my mortality do make Ordain and ratify this my Last Will and Testament hereby revoking & annulling all former Wills and Testaments whatsoever - I Give and Bequeath my soul into the hands of Almighty God in certain hope of resurrection to Eternal Life thro the merits Christ my Saviour - I Commit my Body to the Earth to be decently Buried at the discretion of my Executors, and my Debts and Funeral Charges being first paid I dispose of my worldly goods as followeth - I Impart and Give and Bequeath unto my Beloved Wife Mary Smith my Estate Real and Personal (after my Debts and funeral Charges paid) (Containing fifty acres of Land adjoining Mr. Samuel Smith which I dispose of in the following Article) To her & her Heirs forever - I Give and Bequeath unto my Beloved Nephew John Smith fifty acres of Land on the West Side of my Tract of Land on which I now dwell & adjoining that Tract of Land on which Mr. Samuel Smith now dwells to him & his Heirs for ever & Lastly I Constitute & Appoint, my Beloved Wife Mary Smith to be my Executor, my Beloved Nephew John Smith and my Trusty Friend Samuel to be Executors of This my Last Will & Testament this Seventeenth day of September Anno Domini One Thousand Seven Hundred & Thirty Eight in the Twelfth Year of the

Great Majesty's Reign
