Amen, the first day of January One thousand Seven hundred and thirty six I, Charles Russell Esq^r of Berkeley County in the Province aforesaid being of sound health of body mind and memory thanks be to God for it, therefore calling to mind the mortality of my body and knowing that it is appointed for all men once to die do make and Ordain this my last Will and Testament that is to say Principally and first of all I Give and Recommend my soul into the hands of God that have it and my body to the Earth to be buried in a Decent manner at the Direction of my Executors nothing Doubting but at the General Resurrection I shall Receive the same again by the mighty Power of God as touching such Worldly Estate as it hath Pleased God to bless me with in this life Give and Devise of the same in the following manner and form.

In primis I leave my Whole and sole Estate whether Real or Personal to be Equally Divided between my Will Beloved Wife Mary Russell and her Children that is to say Richard Heally, William Heally, Charles Russell Sophianis, Russell, John Russell, Eugenia Russell and Joseph Russell that is to say after all my Lawfull Debts are Paid.

Secondly I do appoint my abovesaid Will Beloved Wife Mary Russell my Whole and sole Executrix Revoking all former Wills by me hitherto made or done in any wise Whatsoever, In Witness Whereof I have hereunto sett my hand and seal the day and Date above mentioned, signed sealed and.
