Gentleman being weak of body but sound of judgment and und-
erstanding doe make this my last will and Testament in manner
and form following.

Imprimis. I bequeath ~~my~~ body to the grave (hoping for the Resurrection of
the dead and life everlasting) and my soul to God who gave it,

Item. Give unto my Dear and well Beloved Wife Janet McQueen my =
Plantation in London with houses and all that belongs to it in any
manner of way whatsoever together with thirty Negroes which she
may choose out of all that belongs to me except those hereafter men-
tioned which plantation and Negroes I give to her the said Janet,
McQueen and her heirs for ever.

Item.

Item. Give unto my naturall son John McQueen all my Interest in the
lands of Thomas Smith and Company according to Articles of
Agreement between my self the said Thomas Smith and James Fraser,
likewise one Negroe boy now at Savannah Town named Fels together
with my half of Hoggs Heads and Hares about Savannah Town the
Other Belonging to Thomas Smith.

Item. Give unto my Loving Cousin Elizabeth McQueen Daughter to = =
Alexander McQueen One Hundred pounds Currency and one Negroe
girl now at Edisto.

Item. Give unto my sister in Law Elizabeth Read One Negroe girl.

Item. Give unto my Mother in Law Jane Read One Negroe girl.

Item. Bequeath unto my Cousin James McQueen my half of the House and
workes at Savannah Town after the expiration of three years till which
time they remain for the Benefit of Thomas Smith and Company.

Item. my Negroe Cooper, Sumbow and Hector about Negroe I have sold to Tho.
Smith and own my self fully satisfied for them.

Item. after all my Debts and Funerall Charges are discharged I leave the remain-
der of my Estate to my Loving Wife Janet McQueen and her heirs for ever
appointed my Loving Friend Thomas Smith and George Sommers Esqrs
to this my last Will and Testament to the full filling of which I bind my
self my heirs Executors administrators and assigns As Witnesses my
hand this twelfth day of February One thousand seven hundred &
thirty six, given in presence of us signed sealed and Delivered.

lina Planter being of sound and perfect mind and memory Do
make and Ordaine this my present last Will and Testament in -
manner following First and principal I commend my soul into the
hands of Almighty God that gave it me and my body I commit to the
earth to be decently buried and as touching my temporal Estate I
give and dispose thereof as followeth.

I Impowr Will that all my just Debts and funeral expences be first paid.

Item I Give Devise and bequeath unto my loving Wife Martha the use of
my Plantation whereon I now live consisting of One Hundred and
thirty Acres of land and also of an negro Woman named Venus with
a young Child and her increase my said Wife to have peaceable use of
the said plantation negro Woman and Child with her increase -
During her natural life with all the appurtenances thereunto,
belonging all which above said legacies and bequeaths I Give Devise
and bequeath unto my said loving Wife Martha in full and for her
Power.

DOWN and third or share of my Real and personall which
she can or may Claim by any ways means or pretence whatsoever
out of my said real or personall Estate.

Item I Give and bequeath unto my youngest son James Combe the said
plantation whereon I now live to be enjoyed after his Mothers Decease
or hath attained to the age of majority, To have & to hold the said
Plantation (after my Wife Decease) to my said son James his heirs and
assigns for ever.

Item I Give and hereby authorize and empower my Executor and Executor
hereafter named and the survivor of them to sell and dispose of the
five hundred Acres of land that were Run out for me on Winyaw
Whereof the plot is in the Office to be Annued to a grant for the most
money that can be gotten for it which money with the rest of my =
Personall Estate I Give Devise and bequeath to all my Children John
Paul Francis Phillip Dagmaris Mary Magdalen Susannah and
Martha to be equally Divided and shared amongst them.

Item I Ordaine Establish and appoint my loving Wife Martha
Executor and my loving son John Executor of this my Last Will
and Testament hereby Revokeing and annulling all Other
Wills and Testament heretofore by me made and this to be and
Remain for my Last Will and Testament, In Witnes's
Whereof I have set my hand and hal this 22^d day of february
1794/5.
