 day of February 1736 by Dunham MacGregor of Orange County
 in the Province of South Carolina Compuncted being very sick and
 Weak in body but of perfect mind and generous thanks be given unto
 God, do make and Ordaine this my last Will and Testament, that
 is to say principally and first of all I Give and Recommend my Soul
 into the hands of God that gave it and my body I recommend to the
 Earth to be buried in a Decent Christian Buriall at the Discretion
 of my Executors and as touching such worldly Estate wherewith it,
 hath pleased God to bless me in this life I Give and dispose
 of the same in the manner following to wit
 I Give and bequeath to Mary my Wife the one third part of all
 that I am Owner of, viz. Negroes Cattle and household goods
 Whome I do Comitt unto make and ordain my sole Executrix of this
 my last Will and Testament
 I Give and bequeath to my Daughter Elizabeth MacGregor all
 the remaining part of what I am Owner of, I Witness Whereof
 I have hereunto set my hand and Seal the day and year above
 Written

March 3rd 1736 this day appeared
 before me the Hon^{ble} Thomas Osgoodton

 Sworn, Declared that they were present and saw the Testator Dunham
 MacGregor sign Seal and pronounce this to be his last Will and Testam^{ent}
 and that he was at that time of sound disposing mind Memory, and
 that the other Subscribing Witness Amos Dyer signed her name at the
 same time with him and in presence of the said Testator and that the word
 February was written at the same time
