 duly sworn on the Holy Evangelist of Almighty God  
 declared they were present and saw John Dunn the  
 Testator Sign Seal publish and Declare the within  
 Instrument of Writing to be & contain his last Will and  
 Testament and that howev<sup>r</sup> at the same time of seeing  
 & Disposing of mind Memory and understanding to  
 the Best of these Deponents Knowledge & Belief and  
 further that they together with Jane Lake Signed their  
 Names as Witnesses in the presence of the Testator

Recorded this 30 day of Octob<sup>r</sup> 1799  
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In the Name of God Amen  
 Edward Shrewsbury of Charles Town in the County of  
 Berkely in the Province of South Carolina Compeere being  
 in perfect health & of sound mind Memory & Understanding  
 but considering the Certainty of Death & the uncertainty of  
 the time thereof make & declare my last Will & Testament

Manner and form following (that is to say) In presence of  
 my mind my soul to God the Creator thereof only hoping  
 thereby to receive a full Remission of all my sins through the  
 merit and intercession of Our Lord and Saviour Jesus Christ  
 in that worldely State which God through his infinite goodness  
 has pleased to trust me with and that I shall be any ways impleased  
 at the time of my Death be it either real or personal or of any  
 nature or kind soever I Give and Bequeath the same unto my  
 & Loving Wife Mary Shrewsbury to hold unto my said wife  
 heirs and assigns forever And I Do Nominate and appoint my  
 Wife Mary Shrewsbury to be whole and sole Executrix of this  
 Will and I do revoke all others or former Wills by me at any time  
 before made declaring this to be my only last Will & Testament  
 Witness whereof I Tho<sup>s</sup> and Edward Shrewsbury have hereunto  
 set my hand & Seal this 18 day of May Anno Domini 1791/92 And in  
 the fifth Year of the Reign of Our Sovereign Lord George the second  
 King of Great Britain &c.

I Peter Morque of the Parish of St Philips Church Town in the  
Province of South Carolina being weak in Body but of sound & perfect  
Mind & Memory sheweth to you for the same Do make & declare this  
my last Will & Testament in manner & form following viz<sup>t</sup> First and  
Principally I commend my Soul into the hands of Almighty God  
my Body to the Earth to be buried in Christian like manner  
in hope of a joyfull resurrection & to receive pardon for all my  
Sins through the merits of Our Most sweet & glorious Jesus Christ  
and as touching such worldly Estate wherewith I have pleased

to be left me withage I have done and dispose thereof as  
with this my present Will and desire that all my just  
and funeral charges be first paid discharged and satisfied  
I give and bequeath unto my Brother Jeremiah Morque  
the sum of Two hundred Crowns of that County Money  
then in the hands of Mess<sup>rs</sup> Abraham Davis & William  
to him & his heirs forever He my Wife and I being at the  
same time & place Magdalina Jacquessy & Cotton Side One  
Crown each of that same County money above mentioned  
I will & desire that after my just debts and funeral charges above  
paid be paid out of what Effects I am possessed in this Parish of St Philips  
Town South Carolina may be due to the said advantage & the money  
I appoint that Mr Salomon Legare Sen<sup>r</sup> & Mr Haiah  
of this Parish to be my Executors, my Will is that all the Effects  
I am possessed in this Province may be equally divided in three parts  
one third unto Peter Willough of this Parish One third Salomon  
Legare One third Haiah Bruggett both of this Parish to be possessed

as they think proper In Witness whereof I have set my  
hand & Seal the fifth day of September One thousand seven hundred  
thirty nine
