 Betty, on the sum of one hundred and thirty pounds
 Current money aforesaid in lieu of the said Negro
 Girl, in case for the said Anne Loughton shall elect
 the same I do give to my two sons Alexander Wood
 and Adam Wood the sum of five Pounds Current money
 a Piece. AND after Payment of the Legacies aforesaid
 mentioned and of all my just Debts if any such
 shall appear I do give and bequeath to my beloved
 Son John Wood the Rest and Residue of all my Estate
 of every Nature and kind whatsoever AND hereby
 Revoking all former Wills and Dispositions by me
 made I Declare this to be my last will and Testament
 and I appoint my much Esteemed Friend Gabriel
 Manigault herein aforesaid named my sole Executor
 In witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand
 and Seal this Eighth Day of October in the Year of
 our Lord God One thousand seven hundred and
 thirty seven.

and Declare the same to be and contain his last Will and Testament
and that he was at the same time of sound and disposing Mind
and Memory and understanding to the best of his Depo-
nents Knowledge and belief & further that he the said Depo-
nent together with Thomas Lenoir and James Cadrock signed their
Names as Witnesses thereto in Presence & at the request of the Testator.

Do make and Ordain this my Last Will and Testament
That is to say Principally & first of all I give & recommend
my soul into the hands of God that gave it and for my body
I recommend it to the Earth to be buried in a Christian like
and Decent Manner at the Discretion of my Executors -
Nothing Doubting but at the General Resurrection I
shall Receive the same by the mighty Power of God and
as touching such worldly Estate wherewith it has pleased
God to bless me in this Life I give Devise and Dispose of the
same in the following Manner and Form.

Imprimis It is my Will and so Order that in the
first Place all my Just Debts and Funeral Charges
be Paid and Satisfied.

Item The Residue and Remainder of my Estate real
and Personal I give unto my Son & Daughters -
Thomas Lenoir and Sarah Smart Wife of William
Smart to be Divided between them that is to say two
thirds thereof to my Son Thomas and the remaining one
third to my said Daughter Sarah to them and their
Heirs for ever.
