 and thirty & thirty seven. Isaac Stewart being but Weak of Body but
 of perfect Mind and Memory Thanks be to almighty God therefore
 willing to Mourn the Mortality of my Body and knowing that it is
 appointed for man once to die. Do make & Ordain this my Last Will
 & Testament That is to say Principally and first of all I
 give & Recommend my Soul into the hands of God that have it. Hoping
 through the Merits Death and Passion of my Saviour Jesus Christ
 to have full and free Pardon & forgiveness of all my Sins & to inherit
 everlasting life. And my Body I Commit to the Earth to be
 decently buried at the discretion of my Executors hereafter named
 nothing doubting but at the General Resurrection I shall receive the
 same again by the mighty Power of God And as touching such
 worldly Goods and Estate wherewith it has pleased God to Bless me
 with in this Life I Give Devise and dispose of the same in the
 following manner & form That is to say, first I Will that all those
 debts & duties as I do owe in Right or Conscience to any manner of
 Person or Persons whatsoever shall be well and truly paid and
 contented or ordained to be paid in Convenient time after my
 decease by my Executors hereafter named Item I Give and
 bequeath unto my Loving Wife Elizabeth Stewart Five hundred
 pounds Current Money of South Carolina to be paid to her Out of
 my Estate after my Death & likewise One Negro Woman named
 Mary which is now in my Possession One Indian Wome, One

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I, Wm. James of the County of York in the State of Virginia do hereby certify that I am the owner of a certain plantation which said land was by me formerly given by a deed bearing date the first of October 1785 and a One Cedula of the State of Virginia and bequeath unto my four sons James, John, James and Joseph eleven hundred acres of land lying on Chatham to be equally divided between them further my Will is that my son James, John, James and Joseph shall pay each of them as they shall come to the age of twenty years the sum of One hundred pounds and my two Daughters Martha and Elizabeth to be paid them in the manner as followeth two hundred pounds of the four to be paid to my daughter Martha as soon as my son John shall come to the age of twenty years the other two hundred pounds to be paid to my daughter Elizabeth when my youngest son Joseph shall arrive to the age of twenty years & in case that either of my Sons shall die before they come to the age of twenty years then the succeeding heir of the person so Deceasing shall pay the Deceased persons part of the money to my two Daughters which is the sum of One hundred pounds as afore mentioned Further my Will is that my Loving Wife Elizabeth Shewell shall have a sufficient maintenance of provisions on the plantation which belongeth to my house During her Widowhood & no longer & to have free privilege of living in the dwelling house now on the said plantation with the privilege of making use of the Roads leading & other household Goods as shall be thought necessary & she shall have occasion of during the time that she continues a Widow & of raising what money she

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shall feel and further my Will is that the said land which is my personal estate shall be equally divided between my four sons and two Daughters Martha and Elizabeth as soon as they shall come to the age of twenty years to them & the heirs of their Wives & in case my youngest daughter Elizabeth shall die without her part of the good & money paid her shall return back to the State and be equally Divided among my other Children & the other part of my estate to the same persons and in the same manner Further & Lastly my Will is that my Wife Elizabeth shall have one Negro Woman named Florow to wait & attend on her During the whole time she shall continue a Widow all which time the said Negro named Florow shall be the property of my Wife and none else and after wards the said Negro named Florow shall be joynd to the Rest of my estate to be divided among my Children and I do hereby utterly revoke & disannull all and every other former Testaments Wills and Legacies Requests & Executors by me any way before this time named and do own this to be my last Will and Testament and do here nominate & appoint my Loving Friends William Wendell, Thomas Wickham and my son James whole and sole Executors of this my last Will and Testament in Witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal the Day & Year above written
