 Make this my last Will and Testament in and under following that  
 is to say Imprimis I Will that all my just Debts and funeral  
 Expences be paid from I Give and bequeath to Thomas Corbett  
 of Charles Town Gent my Mahogany Book Case my Silver Book  
 Pick Case and a Small Case of Instruments covered with Blue  
 Sattin Green from I Give and bequeath unto Childermas Croft of  
 Charles Town & forward my Gold Watch and my Silver Pilled  
 from I Give and bequeath unto Gabriel Manigault of Charles  
 Town Esq. the sum of Twenty pounds Sterling & money of equal Value  
 from I Give and bequeath unto Robert Thorpe Esq. my Tortois  
 Shell Ring with the Gold Lin from I do hereby give devise  
 and bequeath unto the said Gabriel Manigault, Thomas Corbett  
 and Childermas Croft and to their heirs Executors Administrators  
 for ever all the rest and residue of my Estate both real and personal  
 whatsoever and wheresoever Upon the special Trust and Confidence  
 & Power the life that is to say Upon Trust that they the said Gabriel  
 Manigault, Thomas Corbett and Childermas Croft do sell and  
 dispose of all such Estate both real and personal as aforesaid  
 that I shall dye possessed of and the monies arising from the  
 Sale of the same do set out at Interest in the province of South  
 Carolina all which Interest I do hereby give and bequeath unto  
 my Mother Justina Amyand Widow for and during the Term of  
 her Natural Life And I do hereby devise order direct and require that  
 such Interest be Annually remitted to my said Mother who lives at  
 Abertown in the Principality of Wales from after the Decease

of my Mother than I do give devise and bequeath unto Thomas  
 and Childermas Croft. aforesaid and to their heirs Executors and  
 assigns to be equally divided between them all the above said Residue  
 of Estate and the monies arising from the Sale thereof which is  
 directed to be set out at Interest for the use of my Mother during  
 her Natural life And I do hereby appoint the said Gabriel Manigault  
 Thomas Corbett and Childermas Croft. Executors of this my Will hereby  
 being all former Wills and Testaments by me heretofore made  
 declaring this only to be my last Will and Testament In Witness  
 whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal this Seventh day of  
 the month of October in the Year of Our Lord One thousand Seven hundred and thirty  
 Nine and in the thirteenth Year of his Majesty's Reign

 Memorandum I Leave my Negro Boy Sam to M<sup>r</sup>. Thomas  
 Corbett I had forgot this in the Will but I now declare it to be  
 my Intention & Devise

 Lieutenant Governour & Ordinary of this province On the  
 17th Day of October 1739 Personally came and appeared  
 Isaac Amyand and William Freeman Two of the Witnesses  
 within Will of Isaac Amyand who being an Englishman

True True of Charlestown my Trusty & well beloved friend Exor  
and my said wife Johanna Partic of this my Last Will & Testamen

South Carolina Before me the Hon<sup>ble</sup> William Bull Esq  
Lieutenant Governour & Commander in Chief in & Over this  
Province & Ordinary of the same On the eighth Day of October

Subscribing Witnesses to the within Instrument of Writing who  
being duly Sworn on the Holy Evangelist of Almighty God declared  
they were present & saw John Johnson the Testator Sign Seal  
Publish and Declare the within Instrument of Writing to be & Contain  
his Last Will and Testament & that he was at the same time of Sound  
disposing Mind Memory & Understanding to the best of these Dep<sup>ts</sup>  
Knowledge and belief And further that they together with  
Amory the other Subscribing Witnesses did sign their Names as  
Witnesses to the said Will in the presence of the Testator
