God for the same, doe make and Ordeyne this my last will
and Testament in manner and forme, following, (that is to
say) First and principally, I give and bequeath my soul into
the hands of my Almighty Creator, hoping for pardon and
forgiveness of all my sins in and through the meritts and
Intercession of Jesus Christ my only blessed Saviour and redeemer
and my Body I Commit to the Earth to be buried in such
Decent manner as my Executors hereinafter named shall
think meet and Convenient, and as Concerning such
Temporal Estate as by the blessing of God I am now possessed
of I give and Dispose thereof as followeth, I am I give and
bequeath all that my two lots of land withall the building's
Edifices, Tenements, and Hereditaments whatsoever therunto
belonging situate lying and being at ashley Ferry in the
Parish aforesaid unto my Dear and Loving Wife Elizabeth
Street, during the Term of her natural life, and then unto y:
Children of my Brother, Thomas Street (of the County of Surry in
old England) namely, William, Thomas Mary and Jane,
Street, and unto the Children of my Brother John Street (of the
same County of Surry) namely, William, Anne and Jane Street
to be Equally Divided amongst them and to the heirs of their
Bodies lawfully to be begotten for Ever, Item, all my Goods -
Chattles

Given by the said Infant Child when she shall attain to the age
of Twenty One years.

twentieth and last day of December in the year of our Lord God One
Thousand Seven hundred thirty and five, 1735, James Hethy in
Winyaw prince frederick parish and County of Craven Planter being very
weak in Body but in perfect mind and memory thanks be given to God
therefore Calling unto mind the mortality of my body and knowing
that it is appointed for all men once to die, do make and Ordein this my
last Will and Testament that is to say principally and first of all I
give and Recommend my soul unto the hands of God that have it and
for my body I Recommend it to the Earth to be buried in a Christian like
manner at the Discretion of my executors nothing doubting but at the
General Resurrection I shall Receive the same again by the mighty
Power of God, and as touching such worldly Estate wherewith it hath
pleased almighty God to bless me in this life I give during and Dispose
of the same after and in the following manner and form,
I give and bequeath to Robert Young my Wifes son or my Son
in Law fifty pounds this Currency
I am I give and bequeath to my Daughter Margret Hethy fifty pounds
this

This Currency this to be paid after my Death
 As to the remaining part of my Estate I leave as followeth Viz.
 Item, I give and bequeath to my Dear & beloved Wife one
 third part of my Estate this remaining
 Item, I give and bequeath unto my beloved Son Robert Fetherly the
 remaining two third parts of my Estate and my Will is
 that During his minority the said two third parts of my
 Estate Remain in the hands of my loving Wife during her
 Widowhood but in case my Wife should enter married then my
 Will is that the said two third parts of my Estate shall Return
 unto the hands of my other Co's hereafter mentioned for the
 use of my said son and in case of mortality to any of my said
 Children must till what what is hereby bequeathed to the
 Defunct shall be Equally divided amongst the Survivors, Lastly
 I nominate and appoint my Loving Wife Elizabeth and William
 Swinton Esq's, Item James Fisher of Charles Town and James
 Fetherly to be Co's. over my last will and Testament and I do
 hereby utterly disallow Revoke and Quannul all and every
 other former Testaments Wills and legacies Requests and Co's
 by me in any way before this time named Willed and bequeathed
 Rightful and Confirm this and no other to be my last Will and
 Testament. In Witness hereof I have hereunto set my hand
 and seal the day and Year above Written.

of South Carolina Merchant Considering the uncertain time we
have in this life and being in perfect sense and memory blessed
be the Lord therefore Do this twelfth day of November in the
year of Our Lord One thousand seven hundred and thirty six &
the fifth year of the reign of George the second of Great Britain
Kings and Ireland King of Great Britain and publish this my
last Will and Testament in manner and form following that is to say
I do hereby Command my soul into the hands of almighty God
who gave it and my Body to the Earth from whence it came in
hope of a Joyfull Resurrection through the alone merits of my Lord
and Saviour Jesus Christ and as to that Worldly Estate which it
has Pleased God to Bless me with I dispose thereof as follows to Wit

Thomas the said Thomas Himberley of Charles Town
Chair maker did by a Deed of Gift or Giftment bearing date the
fourteenth day of November Anno Domini 1731, with the Consent
and approbation of my said Wife Isobel Himberley testified by her
setting her hand and seal thereto in Consideration of my good
Will and affection to my Daughter in Law Anna Shute Wife of
Joseph Shute and of her Shillings Current money did give grant
conveyance sell transfer Conveyance and Confirm a tract of Land
containing six acres English measure be the same more or less
situate in Berkeley County near Charles Town lately bought and
purchased of George Claypool as by indentures of Lease and Release
bearing Date the fourteenth and fifteenth days of March Anno
Domini 1728, to have and to hold the said six acres of Land with all
houses Edifices Buildings as shall be thereafter build thereon
and all appurtenances thereon then standing growing or being or
thereunto belonging or in any wise appertaining unto the said
Anna Shute Wife of the said Joseph Shute her heirs and assigns for
ever and which deed of Gift or Giftment contains sundry
Declarations Covenants agreements and provisions as by the said
deed reference being thereunto had will more fully appear the
said Thomas Himberley do hereby Confirm and allow of the said
Deed of Giftment or Gift and of every thing therein contained &
do hereby Devise the said tract to the persons and uses in the said
Deed mentioned according to the intention of the said Deed and
subject to the several Covenants and Declarations therein made
(to wit) to my said Wife Isobel for life Remainder to the said Anna
Shute and her heirs for ever Item My wife and I do give and
another John Himberley One Shilling Sterling Item My wife and I
do give all the Real and Personal of my Estate real or personal
and all my goods and Chattels to my Beloved Wife Isobel Himberley
