 and first of all Give and Recommend my Soul into the hands of
 who gave And for my Body I recommend it to the Earth to be buried
 in a Christian like & decent Manner at the discretion of my Executors
 Nothing Doubting but at the general Resurrection I shall receive
 Same by the mighty Power of God And as touching such World
 Estate wherewith it has pleased God to bless me in this Life I give
 Devise and dispose of the same in the following Manner I Give
 Impremise I Leave and bequeath to Jean Kelly my dear
 beloved Wife the third part of my Estate whether in Lands, Houses
 Moveables or any thing whatsoever belonging to me at this present
 2^d I Bequeath to my Son Brown Kelly four Negro Slaves named
 Jack, Tishar, Peter & Nell and I likewise leave & bequeath to
 Forward Son One hundred Cows and twenty head of Cattle besides
 I also bequeath to my above mentioned Son a Tract of Land Containing
 three hundred Acres adjoining to a Tract of Land belonging to
 M^r Coover Martin in Ponapon in Colleton County I also will that
 said Son shall have two Horses named Jack & Tishar & I leave
 bequeath to my Daughter Elizabeth three Negro Slaves named
 Denbigh, Mall & Flora with Twenty Cows & Calves & I
 I bequeath to my Mother Mary Kelly Twenty Cows & Calves &
 I bequeath to Mary Craig my Sister forty Cows & Calves &
 I leave & bequeath to Mary Rymon my Niece five Cows & Calves
 I will Lewis Rymon to have two Horses named Blew Mouth &

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 11th Dick 8th I Bequeath to Ann Welch my Niece five Cows and
 9th of Latimer's Constitution made in & Ordain John Craig above
 in New Town or Thomas Burr in Ponapon and Jean Kelly my
 my only & sole Executors of this my Last Will & Testament, And I
 do by this follow revoke and Reannull all former Testaments Wills
 Legacies request & Executors by me in any way before this time made
 and bequeathed Ratifying and Confirming this and no other to
 last Will and Testament. In Testimony whereof I have hereunto

 County deceased to be his Last Will and Testament, And that he would
 truly administer all the singular the Goods Rights & Credits of the said

Deceased and pay his Debts and Legacies as far as his Estate will
Extend and the Law shall bind her. And that she will make a true &
Perfect Inventory and appraisement of all and Good Rights and
Credits of the said deceased and return the same into the Secretarys Office
of the Province of South Carolina, according to the time prescribed by

of Charlestown in the Province of South Carolina a Merchant being
at present but of Body but of sound Memory and Judgement
calling to mind the transitory Nature of this present Life and that
is appointed for all Men Once to dye thought proper to make this
my last Will and Testament in form following and first I recommend
my Soul to Almighty God who gave it Hoping and confidently believing
to have a joyful Resurrection through the Merits of Jesus Christ
and as touching such Worldly Effects with which it hath pleased God
to Bless me I Give and Bequeath the same in Manner following
after the interment of my Body in decent Manner at the discretion
of my Executors I Will that all my Lawful Debts and funeral Charges
be paid I Give and bequeath all my Estate Real and Personal all
Debts and sums of Money owing or to be due to me by any persons
all Goods and Merchandise and Others whatsoever to me belonging
in any way appertaining unto my Beloved Wife Lydia Scott
during her life and afterwards unto Mary Scott my Lawful daughter
I Will that all my Estate be sold by my Executors hereafter named

the two aforesaid that is to say my said Wife and said Mary
daughter and her heirs and assigns as before partly I Give
James Scott my servant be discharged from all further
liability to me my heirs or assigns and his heirs be discharged
duly after my decease when ever the same shall happen
and he shall make up and make full satisfaction what I have already
advanced by me towards making Soap & Candles for the use of my
house and daughter and finally I Will that my Executors pay the said James
Scotts Current I Do hereby revoke all former and Other Wills
wherefore made declaring this to be my last Will and Testament
I Give and appoint M^r Thomas Pinnet and John
Lennan House Wrights the Executors of this my last Will and
Testament I Will that no person whereof I have been to let my hand
shall this Twenty second day of August an no Dom 1739
publish and Declare signed
sealed as my last Will and
