In the Name of God Amen the Twelfth Day of March in the Year of Our Lord God 1797 I Richard Williamson of South Carolina in Colleton County Gentleman being very Sick in Body but of perfect Mind and memory thanks be given to God therefore Calling unto Mind the Mortality of my Body and knowing that it is appointed for all men Once to Die do make and Ordain this my Last Will and Testament (That is to say principally and first of all I Give and Recommend my Soul unto the hands of God that gave it and for my Body I Recommend it to the Earth to be Buried in a Christian like and Decent Manner at the Direction of my Executors Nothing Doubting but at the General Resurrection I shall Receive the same again by the Almighty power of God and as touching such worldly Estate wherewith it has pleased God to Bless me in this Life I Give Devise & Dispose of the same in the following manner & form I Give & Give and Bequeath to Elizabeth and Maria Gaunt Smith my Beloved wife five pounds good and Lawful Money to be raised and Levied out of my Estate together with all my household Goods & moveables Item I Give to my wife Elizabeth's eldest Daughter Elizabeth
