Own Choice and also one third part of the moveables in the house
but in case that the Issue of my Wife be male She shall have
four and if it be female but three Negroes and the plantation
and One third of the moveables goods and Chattels if any in
case that the Child shall die before it comes to the age of
Sixteen the or the day of marriage the Childs part to go to my
Wife Sarah Roman and to have the said plantation during
her Widowhood and then to go to the next heir the Remain-
der part to go to my Son. Further I make Sarah Roman during
his life and after his death to fall to the next heir,
Hem I do give and bequeath unto my loving Wife after my
first debts and funeral expences are paid the Remainder to be
Returned to my loving Wife and Lastly I do nominate and
appoint my friend John Hale and my Brother Thomas Hute
and my friend Noah Servey to be Executors and Guardians of this
last Will and Testament, In Witness Whereof I have here-
unto set my hand and Seal this 11th day of
March 1736/7.
