I John Wauchope of Charles Town Merchant being weak in Body & of perfect Memory and Understanding Do make & publish & Ordain this my Last Will and Testament First and Principally I Command my Soul into the hands of Almighty God hoping for Salvation through the Merit & Dealt of my Lord & Only Saviour Jesu Christ and my Body to the Earth from whence it came to be buried in Decent Manner Item I Give & Bequeath unto my Beloved Father James Wauchope of Camerton in the Kingdom of Scotland after the payment and Satisfaction of my just & Lawful Debts all my Estate both real & personal of what Nature soever & in case of my Death unto my beloved Brother & Sisters in life to be equally and proportionably divided amongst them and I Do appoint my Dear Friend and Cousin John Scoume of Charles Town Aforesaid Merchant Executor of this my Last Will and Testament hereby revoking all former and other Wills by me theretofore made There fore to Set my Hand & Seal this Twenty fourth day of September anno Domini One thousand Seven hundred and Thirty nine
