thesaid infant Child to the said Joseph Haufort
according to his Desire, hereby charging him
that he do maintain him in male Dress,
washing, Lingerie, Clothing, and such good Education
as may be fitting, according to the Circumstances
and Interest of the said infant Child during his
Minority, and that the said Joseph Haufort do
enquire into and take Care and Charge of his
Estate, both Real and Personal, and all other things
as administrator by Law may do, and return and
faithfull Account thereof, and what Estate of the
said Joseph Haufort, shall come to his hands
to render, when he shall be thereto required by such
Guardians, as shall be chosen by the said infant
Child when he shall attain to the age of One
and Twenty years.

Whereas Sanford Cole late of the County of Sarmathen in the
Principality of Wales Esquire deceased, made and executed his last
Will and Testament in Writing bearing date the Eighteenth Day of
January one thousand seven hundred and thirty one and therein
Appointed Magdalen Cole and Thomas Cole Executors and executor as by
the said Will and Probate thereof under the Seal of the Prerogative Court
of Canterbury appears, and Whereas whilst the said Sanford Cole lived
and at the time of his Death he had diverse Goods Rights and Credits
within the province of South Carolina aforesaid, by means whereof
the full Disposition and power of Granting the Administration of all
and Singular the Goods Rights and Credits of the said Deceased within
the province aforesaid, and also auditing the accounts calculations and
Reckonings of the said admors, and a final Dismission from the
same to one is manifestly known to belong, and whereas the
Affairs of the said Magdalen Cole, and Thomas Cole will not permit
them to come to this province, and Desiring that the Goods Rights and
Credits of the said Sanford Cole deceased which are in the Province
May be well and truly administered forwarded and Disposed of Do hereby
Grant unto you the said John Carruthers (in whose fidelity in this
behalf I very much confide) full power by the tenor of these presents
to administer the Goods Rights and Credits of the said Deceased in the
Province aforesaid which to him in his Life time and at the time of
his Death did belong, and to ask collect Levy sue for recover and receive
the same, and to pay the debts in which deceased stood obliged so far
forth as the said Goods Rights Credits will extend according to the
