the funeral the charge of which shall not exceed
Ten pounds Sterling. I Will that the Coffin be plain
without any thing more or better than is usual
it be not covered with apparel and I desire that none
of my Relations put themselves into mourning
Dress. I Give unto my Brother Peter Hurme
a parcel of one Negroe Man named Juarant
and also the share of Jeffrey Hurme Sterling for his
care and trouble in taking up care from the brother
of the execution of this my Will. I Give unto
my son Alexander Hurme his lands and a piece
for ever all that my Brick House in Charles
Town with the office and other Buildings and Land
there belonging which formerly belonged to
Jonathan Hurme. I Give unto my said son outlegs
Carpenter named Harriston for ever I Give
unto my Daughter Susannah Hurme one Negro
man named Carter and one Negroe Girl named
Diana. I Give unto my Wife Elizabeth, one Negro
Man named Anthony and one Negroe Woman
