 April 1708 Personally came & appeared William Dimesney and
 Michael Willure two of the Witnesses to the within Instrument
 of Writing who being duly sworn on the holy Evangelist Declared
 that they saw Samuel Doyleigh the Testator sign and Publish
 Declare the same consisting of Two sheets of Paper to be and
 contain his last Will and Testament And that he was at the
 time of signing and disposing of and disposing of and understanding
 to the best of the Deponents knowledge and Belief, And further
 that they severally Subscribed their Names as Witnesses to the
 same in presence of the said Testator together with John Collock
 the other Witness to the same And further Michael Willure
 further deposed that he saw the said Samuel Doyleigh the Testator
 sign Execute & Publish the said Will to the said within William Dimesney

and Declared the same to be part of the Will of the said
 Will and Testament And further he the Deponent William
 signed their Names as Testifiers thereto in presence of the
 Testator

 charged as soon as possibly may be And the Remain
 of my Estate both Real and Personal in this Province in
 Creek Nation or Else where I will that it be Equally Divided
 that One half of it be for my Loving Wife Martha Doane
 and Half I give unto her my said Wife Martha and to her heirs
 as a Signet for ever As to the Other Half I will that it be sold to
 the Advantage and Turned into Money that the said Money
 be put out at Interest upon Bond with sufficient Security (such as
 shall be approved of by my Executors for the use of my Daughter Martha
 until she shall marry or attain the age of Twenty Years
 until then the said Interest be called in yearly and paid for my
 Daughter or her Guardian towards her Maintenance which
 half of my said Estate I give and Bequeath in manner aforesaid
 to my Daughter and unto her heirs & assigns for ever I do name
 and appoint my said Wife Martha a joint Executrix and do John
 Dorr and Samuel Dorr joint Executors with her my said Wife
 of my last Will and Testament And I do Revoke and Annul all
 my Wills by me heretofore made allowing this Only to be my last

and Legacies as far as his Estate will extend & the same shall be paid you and that you will make a true and perfect Inventory of his Goods, Rights and Credits and return the same into the Clerk's Office of this Court according to the time prescribed by Law in all things behave yourself as an Executor ought to do
