I Maurice Lewis of the Province of South Carolina Esquire being sick and weak in Body but of perfect Mind and Memory thanks be to almighty God Do make and Ordain this to be my last Will and Testament in Manner following First being heartily sorry for my sins past and most humbly hoping forgiveness of the same I Commit my Soul to Almighty God trusting to be saved through the Merit of Jesus Christ and my Body to the Earth to be decently Buried at the Discretion of my Executors and Executors hereafter named and as to my Worldly Estate I Dispose of the Same in Manner following (That is to say) I Give and Devise all my Lands Tenements and Hereditaments and Other my Real Estates forever Situate and being in the Province of South Carolina to be Sold by my Executors and Executors hereafter named or their Survivors or Survivors of them to the best advantage and the Money arising by the Sale be applied to the Making good my Marriage Settlement on my Wife and for the payment of my just Debts and the Overplus if any there be I Give to my said Beloved Wife Jane Lewis and her Heirs I apprehend that my Daughter Elizabeth Lewis will be intitled to the Reversion of my Father's Hereditary Estate in such Case I Constitute and appoint my said honoured and Beloved Father William Lewis of Tryphlowyn in the County of Angleva Esquire and my Dear Mother Ann Lewis his Wife my Uncle Maurice Lewis of the said County Esq. Counsellor at Law and my dear friend and Cousin Thomas Kuffin the Younger of Madras in the County of Curcraven Esquire to be Guardians of my said Daughter and her Estate real and personal until she shall arrive to the age of Twenty One Years or the Day of Marriage And it is my Will and desire that my said Guardians shall remove my said Daughter when she shall arrive to the Age of Eight Years

County of Angleva and that my said Daughter the Younger be unmarried and shall be in all other Circumstances that may concern her in like manner her Father and in Case she shall accept of such Visitation then and in such Case I appoint my said Wife to be Guardian of my said Daughter with the Other Guardians before named And in Case I shall be seized of any Lands or other real Estates in the County of Angleva It is my Will and meaning that nothing herein or my Marriage Articles Contained shall Bar my Wife or her Down in such Lands but that she shall enjoy the same in Full towards the payment of my Debts and making good the aforesaid Marriage Settlement and after to her own proper use whilst she remain a Widow and unmarried I recommend to the said Guardians hereby appointed for my said Daughter to Consult Wealth or splendour in the disposal of my said Daughter in marriage but to match her if possible to a person of moderate Estate and noble Virtues I Do hereby nominate and appoint Jacob Motte of York Town Esq. Executor and my Mother in Law M<sup>rs</sup> Elizabeth Hill and my said Beloved Wife Jane Lewis Executors of this my Last Will and Testament In Witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and Seal this fifteenth day of September in the Year of our Lord a thousand Seven hundred and thirty nine and in the fifth year of his Majesty's Reign Maurice Lewis

From the Hon<sup>ble</sup> William Bull Esquire Lieutenant Governour and  
 Ordinary of the Province of South Carolina aforesaid to me Directed  
 And by Virtue of the same On the fifth Day of October in the Year  
 of Our Lord One thousand Seven hundred and thirty nine and in  
 the thirteenth Year of his Majesty's Reign Personally Came and  
 appeared Charles Sheppard John Gwin and John Rattray  
 Witnesses to the within Instrument of Writing who being duly sworn  
 On the Holy Evangelist of Almighty God Declared they were personally  
 present and saw the within named Maurice Lewis Esq<sup>r</sup> the Testator  
 Sign Seal Publish and Declare the said within Instrument  
 of Writing together with a Counterpart thereof Duly intended  
 and Corresponding and Agreeing with the same in every respect  
 to be & contain his last Will and Testament & that he was at  
 the same time of sound & disposing Mind Memory & Understanding  
 to the Part of these Dep<sup>t</sup> knowledge and Belief & that they their  
 Dep<sup>t</sup> signed their Names thereto as Witnesses in presence  
 at the request of the said Maurice Lewis the Testator And also  
 Further the said several Witnesses depose that the several  
 Interlineations to Wit (in the seveneenth Line) from the top  
 were made at & before the Execution of the said Last Will & Testam<sup>ent</sup>  
 (whereof the within is one part) were executed at the same time  
 & Manner above mentioned by the said Testator as one intended  
 Part & Testament And further that the said Testator at the  
 of executing the said Last Will & Testament as aforesaid in presence  
 of the said several Witnesses Deposition is Ordered Wit and advised  
 that one of the Duplicates of the said Last Will and Testament  
 and Decreed as aforesaid should be deposited & Lodged in the  
 Hands of Benjamin Whitaker of Char<sup>l</sup> Town in the Prov<sup>ince</sup>

The full and Exact Translation from the German into  
 the English Tongue of the last Will & Testament of Ursula Felderin  
 Late of Orangeburgh Township Widow deceased made the 30<sup>th</sup> of August  
 1739 Translated by Christian Mote

Anno 1739 the 30<sup>th</sup> August Have I Ursula Felderin upon  
 my last Bed, in Consideration of my Dear Child, whose name is  
 John Henry Felder I have ordered to be wrote that he after my Death  
 all that from me and his deceased Father shall be left, that shall be as  
 Rightfull Heir as his proper by take to hand, But as the Child is not  
 yet in Condition his from his Father and Mother left Effects himself  
 to Manage, I have I. (as being yet in good Sense) M<sup>r</sup>. Henry Lutzger  
 him in his Care delivered with Body & goods, till he namely John  
 Henry Felder five teen or Twenty years of age shall be, And again  
 promised he to be unto him as a Father & to take Care of his Body  
 and Soul so far God shall give him life & that mentioned Child  
 pay no Boarding unto Henry Lutzger and that the Child be  
 Obedient, to him till said time I now followeth wherein the left  
 Estate consists, First Two hundred Acres of Land left by Father and  
 Mother, More One hundred, More Fifty, Acres from Gelber, in Summa  
 the Child be an Heir of all, be it of Horves of Cattle or of Debts yet standing  
 Out Or House furniture, or whatsoever name it may have
