 and receive the same & to pay the Debts in which the deceased stood
 Obligated so far forth as his Goods Rights & Credits will extend According
 to his Estate & Order of Law being first sworn On the Body Evangelist
 of Almighty God to make a true & perfect Inventory thereof & to
 Exhibit the same into the Secretary's Office in Charlestown in Order
 to be recorded On or before the nineteenth day of March now next
 ensuing And to render a just and true account Calculation and
 reckoning of the said Adminion when the same to require And I Do
 Ordain Depute and Comptroler on the said Daniel Larocke Adminion
 of all & singular the Goods Rights & Credits of the said Deceased
 During the Nonage of the said Martha Blanchamp.

 day of March now next ensuing

 of Bradenaw Island in Colleton County in South Carolina
 being Sick and Weak of Body but of Sound and perfect Memory
 do hereby be God for the same and being willing to settle things in
 Order before I die do dispose of my worldly Estate and of the
 Estate which God hath been pleased to Bless me with in Manner

Recorded this 21st day of Decr 1799.

Mary Hannah's Will (Bundell) O. O. O. A. P.

In the Name of God Amen, I Mary Hannah of
Charles Town in the Province of South Carolina Widow being sick
and weak of Body, but of sound Mind and Memory do make this
Last Will and Testament in manner following. I promise
that all my Just Debts and funeral Charges be first paid
and discharged. Item I give and bequeath unto my Daughter Mary
my wearing apparel together with my Best Bed and new Bed
I also a Suit of Calicoe Curloins lined with Colles Two Table cloths
what small quantity of China, I have with One Gold Spindle and
four dozen silver spoons, and a silver salver Item I give and
bequeath to my Daughter Mary the sum of five hundred Pounds Current
money of South Carolina, which I desire may be lent out at interest by
my Executors hereafter named for her use till she shall attain the age
Eighteen Years and then to be paid to her with the interest Item I
will that all the Real and Personal of my Estate both Real and Personal
residue and where ever may be left and a part of by my
Executors hereafter named, and the money thereby arising
be put out to Interest for the use of my three Youngest Sons Maurice
William and Samuel and the Survivors of them to be Equally
divided between them and to be paid them when they shall respectively
attain the age of Twenty One Years. Item in case my said Daughter
Mary shall happen to die before she attain the age of Eighteen Years
I have said then my Will is that all and every the legacies herein
bequeathed to her shall go to my three Youngest Sons, Maurice
William and Samuel & the Survivors of them to be Equally divided
between them. And Lastly I do hereby nominate constitute
appoint Edward Croft Thomas Boston and Alderman Croft Executors

And for following first my Will is that all my lawful
debts may be paid by my Executors hereafter named and the rest of my
Estate be delivered as hereafter mentioned. In witness whereof I have signed
unto my Loving Friend M^{rs} Sarah Spencer Widow and to the
proper Clergymen lawfully begotten of her own Body all my Estate
both Real & Personal that remains after my funeral Charges
and my other Debts are discharged as above and further my Will
that the above M^{rs} Sarah Spencer by Virtue of this Will be in
after my Death put in full possession as heir to my Estate & further
my Will is that John Spencer and Solomon Forster my Executors
may be my Executors and further in my last Will and Testament
I testify as Witness my hand this Thirty first day of March
in the Year of Our Lord One Thousand Seven Hundred and the
Eight
