paid to her Yearly and Every Year during her natural  
Life by my Executors herein after named I Will I Give  
& devise to my beloved Son Paul Jones One full moiety  
half part of my Mansion or Dwelling House lying &  
being in Broad Street wherein M<sup>r</sup> Charles Shephard  
now liveth & also One full moiety or half part of  
the appurtenances thereto belonging or in any wise  
pertaining And also all that Vacant lot of Land fronting  
the southward on Broad Street I Will I Give and devise  
to my beloved Son Thomas Jones all that other moiety or half  
part of the said Mansion or Dwelling House & the other full  
moiety or half part of the appurtenances thereof his half  
of that part bounded on the westward by Church Street

And is commonly called the Court House <sup>of Salem</sup> and is between the said  
Court House and the present Dwelling House of Gabriel  
Manigault Esq. Item I Give and Devise the Other  
Half part of the last mentioned Lot of Land to my beloved  
Son George James his half part to be admeasured from the  
said Dwelling House of Mr. Manigault Item I Give and  
Bequeath to my said Beloved Son Paul a Tract of Land which  
I purchased from Charlesworth Glover containing by  
Estimation One Thousand Acres or thereabouts <sup>situated</sup>  
on the South Side of Pon-pou River & all the Edifices Building  
and appurtenances thereto belonging or in anywise  
appertaining Item I Give and Bequeath to my said Beloved  
Son Thomas a Tract of Land which I ran out to the South  
ward of Port Royal containing fifteen hundred Acres  
or thereabouts and all the appurtenances belonging thereto  
Item I Give and Bequeath unto my said Beloved  
Son George a Tract of Land containing One Thousand  
Acres or thereabouts which I ran out on Combee  
Item I Give and bequeath unto my Beloved Son  
George a Tract of Land at Beech Hill containing  
five hundred Acres or thereabouts which I purchased  
of Mr. William Gato together with all Edifices and  
Buildings thereon & all appurtenances thereto  
belonging I Give and Bequeath unto my said

Beloved Sons Paul and Thomas all those Slaves  
which I am in possession of in the Right of their Mother to be  
Equally divided between them share and share alike by two  
or different persons which I Desire may be done by such persons  
as know the said Slaves Item I Give and Devise that all  
the Rest of my Slaves which I now have or shall have at the time  
of my Decease shall be divided between my said Sons Paul  
Thomas & George Equally share and share alike by such persons  
as are proper Judges of the Value of those Slaves Item I Give  
and bequeath unto my beloved Brother Thomas James One hundred  
pounds sterling money to be paid him by my Executors within  
One Year after my Decease Item I Give and bequeath (in  
Testimony of the great Regard I have for him) to my Beloved  
Friend Mr. William Hopson One hundred pound Current Money  
of South Carolina to buy himself mourning for me Item I  
Give and bequeath (in Testimony of the Great Regard I  
have for him) to Mr. John Baynatt One hundred pound Current  
Money of South Carolina to buy himself mourning for me & that they  
thereby will constitute and appoint my Dearly Beloved  
Wife and my Dearly Beloved Brother Thomas James and  
my Respected friend Captain Gabriel Drott to be the Executors  
of this my last Will and Testament whom I desire to send my  
beloved Son Paul to England not to return before the  
Date hereof in Case I should happen to dye before that time
