Province of South Carolina being weak in Body but of sound & perfect
Mind & Memory sheweth to you for the same Do make & declare this
my last Will & Testament in manner & form following Viz^t First and
Principally I commend my Soul into the hands of Almighty God
my Body to the Earth to be buried in Christian like manner
in hopes of a joyfull Exurrection & to receive pardon for all my
Sins through the Merits of Our Most Redemptive & Saviour Jesus Christ
and as touching such worldly Estate wherewith I have pleased

to be left me withage I have done and dispose thereof as
with Viz^t I have devised & devised that all my just
and Funerall Charges be first paid discharged and satisfied
I give and bequeath unto my Brother Jeremiah Morque
the sum of Two hundred Crowns of that Count^y Money
to be in the hands of Mess^{rs} Abraham Davis & William
to him & his heirs for ever He my Wife and Bequeath the
said sum unto my Sister Magdalena Jacquessy & Cotton Side One
hundred Crowns each of that same Count^y money above mentioned
I give & devise that after my just Debts and Funerall Charges above
said be paid out of what Effects I am possessed in this Parish of St Philips
Town South Carolina may be sold to the best advantage & the money
I appoint that Mr Salomon Legare Sen^r & Mr Haiah
of this Parish to be my Executors, My Will is that all the Effects
I am possessed in this Province may be Equally Divided in three parts
the third unto Peter Willough of this Parish the One third Salomon
Legare, One third Haiah Bruggett both of this Parish to be possessed
as they think proper In Witness whereof I have set my
hand & Seal the fifth day of September One thousand seven hundred
thirty nine

for all Mankind Once to dye Do Make and Ordain this my last
Will and Testament in Manner and Form Following that is to
Say First And principally I Recommend my Soul to Almighty
God that gave it and my Body to the Earth to be Buried at the
Discretion of my Executors Hereafter named And as touching
the disposing of what Temporal Estate it hath pleased God to
Bestow upon me I Give & Dispose the same as followeth To wit
I Will that all my Debts and Funeral Charges be paid from
I Give and Bequeath unto my Beloved Son Samuel Jovin One
Negro Man named Pompey from I Give and Bequeath unto

My Beloved Son John Jovin five Negro Men named Tom,
Dick, Will, and Henry, and one Negro Woman named Hannah
and One Cyprus Boat And all my Cattle and all my household Goods
and Plantation Tools And all other my Goods & Chattels And to
discharge all Debts due to me for his own Use after my Decease from
I Give and Bequeath to my Beloved Daughter Ann Auguston Fifty
Pounds Curr. Money of the Province to be paid to her by my Son
John Jovin in Twelve Months after my Decease from I Give and
Bequeath to my Daughter Elizabeth Jovin in Case she comes or
arrives in South Carolina Fifty Pounds & Curr. Money of South
Carolina to be paid to her by my Son John Jovin in Twelve Months
after her arrival Lastly I Recommend and appoint John Tripp and
John Chaplins to be my Executors of this my last Will and
Testament after my Decease And I Do hereby Ratify and firmly
acknowledge this and no other to be my last Will and Testament

the Day and Year First above Written
