 Recommend it to the Earth to be Buried in a Christian like I desire to be Buried
 at the direction of my Executors Not doubting but at the General Re-
 surrection I shall receive the same by the Mighty Power of God, and
 touching my worldly Estate wherewith it hath pleased God to Bless
 me in this Life I give devise & Dispose of the same in the following manner

Imprimis I give and Bequeath to my well beloved Friend Mr^r
 Charles Hope Merch^t of George Town all my Real & personal Estate
 and do hereby utterly disallow revoke and disannul all & every former
 Testaments Will and Legacy's & Bequests Relating & Confirming this
 no other to be my Last Will and Testament. Likewise Constitution made and
 Ordain the above Mr Charles Hope my only and Lawful Executor of this
 my Last Will and Testament. Likewise give to Mrs Rebecca Ann
 my good Loving wth I was on my Finger, In Witness whereof I have

 God and as touching such Worldly Estate wherewith it hath pleased
 God to Bless me in this Life I Give advise and dispose of the same in
 the following manner & form, *Imprimis* I Will that all my
 Lawfull Debts be truly & Honestly paid out of my Estate & that
 I Give and Bequeath to Martha my Dear & Beloved Wife the third
 part of all my Moveables of what kind so ever as Cattle Horses
 Household Goods, Goods, Plate, Slaves, & what so ever is left
 after paying my Lawfull Debts together the live of Two hundred
 Acres of that part of my plantation at Spoon next unto John
 Williams Plantation with all the Buildings thereon during
 her Natural Life & the paying the Debt rent & Taxes thereof but
 if my Daughter Mary should Decease this Life before Marriage
 Or having no Lawfull Living Issue my Will is that y^e part of
 Personal Estate left to my Daughter Mary return to her Mother
 & the Land which I gave her during her Natural Life shall
 in such Case be hers & her Heirs for ever. *Item* I Give to my
 well beloved Daughter Katherine another third of all my personal
 Estate of what kind so ever after my Lawfull Debts are paid as before
 mentioned together with one half of the Remainder of my Land
 all spoons & her moiety of this plantation Juano dwell on, & the
 Quarter of a Town Lot in Charles Town with the Buildings thereon
 at Number 68. in the Town Market. *Item* I Give & Bequeath unto
 my well beloved Daughter Mary all the remaining part of my Estate
 both real and personal of what kind so ever together with that
 Hundred Acres of Land left to her Mother & her during her Natural
 Life Provided she Out live her Mother. *Item* I Will also that
 if either of my Children die before they are married or having
 Lawfull Issue that the Land I left them return to the Surviving
 Child but if it should happen that my Wife should be with Child

Disease or should have any more living offspring by me
 Will is that all my Estate except what I left my Wife the Equality
 divided amongst my Children & Her. Likewise constitute
 her & Certain my only & sole Executor of this my last Will &
 Testament my well beloved Wife Martha whom I empower
 & impudicate us to do to pay my debts to sell at the discretion
 or any part of my Estate either real or personal to make payment
 I do hereby utterly disallow void & disannul all Wills
 former Testaments, Wills & Legacies Bequests & Grants
 in any ways before this time made Wills and Bequests,
 giving & confirming this & no other to be my last Will and
 Testament In Witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand
 at the City of New York above written
 Witness my hand Published pronounced & declared
 the said Robert Booth as his last Will and
 Testament, in the presence of us the Subscribers (1757)
