 granted to Daniel Laroche of the province afore^d say^d. During the
 Minority of her the said Martha Blanchamp I therefore desiring
 that the Goods Rights and Credits of the said deceased may be well and

 the said Daniel Laroche (in whose fidelity in this behalf I very much
 Confide) full power by the Tenor of these presents to Administer the
 Goods Rights and Credits of the said deceased which to him in his life
 time and at the time of his Death did belong And to ask money Rent
 and receive the same & to pay the Debts in which the deceased stood
 Obligated so far forth as his Goods Rights & Credits will extend Accord-
 ing to his Estate & Order of Law being first sworn On the Body Evangelist
 of Almighty God to make a true & perfect Inventory thereof & to
 Exhibit the same into the Secretary's Office in Charlestown in Order
 to be recorded On or before the nineteenth day of March now next
 ensuing And to render a just and true account Calculation and
 reckoning of the said Admin^{on} when the same to require And I Do
 Ordain Depute and Comptroler on the said Daniel Laroche Admin^{on}
 of all & singular the Goods Rights & Credits of the said deceased
