this second day of October 1738. I Thomas Ellery of South Carolina Gent being weak in body but of perfect sound and disposing mind memory and understanding thanks be to almighty God for the same do make this my last Will and Testament in manner following That is to say

I bequeath my soul into the hands of almighty God and my body I commit to the Earth expressly charging that no sum of money exceeding five pounds Sterling be laid out in the funeral thereof.

I Item I give to my loving niece Margaret Rowe in consideration of her great care and kindness my large silver cup and plate and to be delivered to her on or after her age of Twenty one or Day of marriage which shall first happen

I Item I give to my loving Brother William Ellery in the City of Westminster Lord Wainor the sum of fifty pounds Sterling

I Item I give to my Sister Mary Ellery the sum of Sixty Pounds Sterling, And I also give to my Sister Margaret Ellery the sum of Six pounds Sterling and if either my said Brother or Sister should happen to be dead at the time of making this my Will then I give the Legacy intended for such Brother or Sister to the Executors or Administrators of them and to their Executors Administrators and Assigns All which I bequeathed Legacies I appoint and direct shall be paid by my Executors hereinafter named at the Carolina Coffee House London full of all manner of Charges on Expenses whatsoever in manner following That is to say the sum of Twenty pounds Sterling to each of them my said Brothers and Sisters within one year after my Death and the sum of Twenty pounds Sterling each to be

be paid annually Till they are repaid Legacies shall be fully and completely paid And I do hereby expressly charge Attorney State Treas and personal with the payment thereof

I Item I give my very loving and affectionate wife Ann Ellery one of the Six Front Lots (being part of Colliers Square) as my Partners Charles Pinney Square and Mr George Hunter shall be pleased to allot unto her Together with all such Building as shall be erected thereupon and also my Two 1/4 In Charles Town Church To hold to my said wife During her Natural life only and from and after her Decease I give and devise the same to my Brother William Ellery his heirs and assigns for Ever

I Item I appoint that all my Just Debts be fully paid by my loving wife Ann Ellery whom I appoint whole and sole executrix of this my last Will and Testament

I Item All the rest and residue of my Estate real and personal That is Lands and Tenements Old goods Houses Cattle and other my moveables whatsoever and wheresoever Debts due on Bonds Notes or otherwise I give devise and bequeath the same and every part thereof unto my said loving wife Ann Ellery and to her heirs Administrators and Assigns for Ever except my Front Lot and Pew which I give to her for her life only as before mentioned and I do hereby revoke all other Wills by me heretofore made In Witness whereof I have to this my last Will and Testament set my hand and Seal the day and year within Written.

I do hereby certify that these presents shall come greeting
Whereas Iulienne Morina Infant Child of Francis
Morina late of this Province died hath this day made humble
application to me that Mr. Peter Richbourg of this Province
planter who hath also desired that he may take into his Care
the Charge and management of the said Infant Child and her Estate
and may be appointed her Guardian therefore for the better
Securing of her Estate and for the more Careful maintenance and
Education of the said Infant Child out of the Confidence I repose in
wisdom and Integrity of him the said Peter Richbourg do hereby
Commit the said Infant Child to the said Peter Richbourg to have the
Charge and Education of the said Infant
Child to the said Peter Richbourg according to their Desires hereby
charging him that he do maintain her in meat drink washing
Lodging Clothing and such good Education as may be fitting
according to the Circumstances and Interest of the said Infant
Child during her minority and that the said Peter Richbourg
do acquit into and take Care and Charge of her Estate both
Real and Personal and do all other things as a Guardian
by Law may do and do and shall be answerable therefor and
what Estate of the said Iulienne Morina shall come to her
hand to render what he shall be hereto required by such Guardian
and shall be Chosen by the said Infant Child when she shall attain
to the age of Twenty one years
