to buy them Rings AND I Do hereby Declare this to be
my Last Will & Testament & Do Renounce & make
Void all former Wills made by me In Witness whereof
I Do set my hand & Seal the Day & Year above Mentioned.

Before me James Michie by Virtue of a Deed of Appointment
from the Honourable William Bull Esq President and Ordinary
of this Province, On the seventh Day of February 1730 Personally
came and appeared Charles Ligon one of the Witnesses to the within
written Instrument who being duly sworn on the holy Evangelist
of Almighty God Declared he was Present & saw Margaret Child
the Testatrix sign Seal Publish and Declare the within Instrum
of Writing to be & contain her last Will & Testament & that she
was at the same Time of Sound and Disposing mind memory
and understanding to the best of the Deponents Knowledge &
Belief & further that he together with the other two Witnesses
Signed his Name as a Witness in Presence of the said Testatrix

Viz First I Recommend my Soul to my Creator
hoping for his Remission of my sins through the
Merits and Intercession of my Saviour Jesus Christ
AND my Body I Desire to be Decently buried by the
Direction of my Executor herein after named but
that my Funeral Charges may not Exceed the sum
of One hundred and fifty Pounds Current money of
this Province & which Sum of One hundred and
Fifty Pounds I Empower my Executor to lay out
for that Purpose. AND I give and bequath to Peter
Manigault Son of Gabriel Manigault of Charles
-Town aforesaid Esq the Sum of three hundred and
fifty Pounds Current money aforesaid I Item I give
and bequath to Paden Bond Son of Jacob Bond of
Christ Church Parish Esq the sum of one hundred
and fifty Pounds Current money aforesaid I Item I
give and bequath to Mary Rowser Daughter of
Richard Rowser late of Christ Church Parish aforesaid
Deceased the Sum of One hundred Pounds Current money
aforesaid I Item I give and bequath to George Puleigh

I son of Samuel Cuddeph son of Charlestown Esq the
 Sum of Two hundred and fifty Pounds Current money
 aforesaid I then Give and bequeath to Miles
 Brewton son of Major Robert Brewton of Christ
 Church Parish aforesaid the sum of one hundred and
 fifty Pounds Current money aforesaid And I give to
 Ann Loughton Daughter of M^r Brewton Wife of the
 said Major Robert Brewton my Negro Girl called
 Betty on the sum of one hundred and thirty pounds
 Current money aforesaid in lieu of the said Negro
 Girl in case free the said Anne Loughton shall elect
 the same I then Give to my two sons Alexander Wood
 and Adam Wood the sum of five Pounds Current money
 a Piece And after Payment of the Legacies aforesaid
 mentioned and of all my just Debts if any such
 shall appear I Give and bequeath to my beloved
 Son John Wood the Rest and Residue of all my Estate
 of every Nature and kind whatsoever And hereby
 Revoking all former Wills and Dispositions by me
 made I Declare this to be my last will and Testament
 and I appoint my much Esteemed Friend Gabriel
 Manigault herein aforesaid named my sole Executor
 In witness Whereof I have hereunto set my hand
 and Seal this Eighth Day of October in the Year of
 our Lord God One thousand seven hundred and
 thirty seven.
