And I do hereby hereby nominate and appoint the said
Scull Sole Executor of this my Last Will and Testament &
I do hereby revoke & disannul all former and other Wills by
me heretofore made Ratified allowing Confirming and
Acknowledging this to stand & be for and as my Only Last will
and Testament In Witness whereof to this my said last
Will & Testament I have hereunto set my hand and Seal
this fourth Day of July Anno Domini 1737.
