Memory (Blessed be God for the same) DO make and
declare this my last Will and Testament as follows
(viz^t) I'm p^rmis - I Will and Desire that all my just
Debts and funeral Charges be paid by my Executor
herein after named as soon as conveniently may be after
my decease AND I'm treat my beloved and Dear kind-
sman Mr Ribton Hutchinson of Charles Town aforesaid
to accept of my Negro Boy called Charley whom I give
and bequeath to him as a Token of my Esteem for him
AND as for all the Rest of my Estate Real personal or
mixt Stock in Trade and all my Goods and Chattels
of what Nature or kind soever the same shall be found
to consist of I Desire and give the same to my Beloved
Brother Thomas Hutchinson and to my three Sisters -

Sarah Hutchinson Ann Hutchinson and Frances
Living all of Whitehaven in the Kingdom of Great
Britam to be remitted to them with all convenient speed
After my decease And my Will is that the Estate hereby given
to my said Dear Brother and Sisters be equally among them
Share and Share alike I Will and Ordain my aforesaid
kinsman Mr Ribton Hutchinson sole Executor of this
my Will and hereby revoking all former and other
Wills by me made This I Declare and Ordain to be my
Last Will and Testament In Witness whereof I
have hereunto set my hand and seal this thirteenth
day of October Anno Domini One Thousand seven hundred
and thirty eight

herein after named shall think proper and as to such
of my Estate real and personal as it has pleased God
Bless with I Will and dispose thereof as follows (viz)
I Give and Bequeath to my Dearly Beloved Wife a
part of the great Regard I have for her One Thousand
pounds Current Money of the province aforesaid to be
paid to her Yearly and Every Year during her natural
Life by my Executors herein after named I Will I Give
and devise to my beloved Son Paul Jones One full moiety
half part of my Mansion or Dwelling House lying &
being in Broad Street wherein M^r Charles Shephard
now liveth & also One full moiety or half part of
the appurtenances thereto belonging or in any wise
pertaining And also all that Vacant lot of Land fronting
the southward on Broad Street I Will I Give and devise
to my beloved Son Thomas Jones all that other moiety or half
part of the said Mansion or Dwelling House & the other full
moiety or half part of the appurtenances thereof his half
of that part bounded on the westward by Church Street
