Body but of sound mind and memory (blessed be God) Do This
Twentieth day of February in the year of our Lord God, one Thousand
Seven Hundred and Thirty nine, make and Publish this my last
Will and Testament in manner following (That is to say)

Imprimis

I give to my young Wife mary Wingood (one Negro woman named Judy,
to her and her heirs forever

Item

I give to my son Charvil Wingood one Negro boy named Josey to him this her heirs

Item

I Give to my son John Sauseau Wingood one Negro Boy named Pompey to him and his
heirs forever

Item

I Give to my Daughter Ann one Negro Child named Sukey to her and her heirs forever

Item

All the Rest and residue of my Goods Chattels and Personal Estate not before
named my Will is that every perticular of them be equally divided between
my young Wife Mary Wingood; my son Charvil; my son John Sauseau Win-
good and my Daughter Ann Wingood to them and their heirs for ever.
and whatsoever money or other Things is made by my Negroes or other Chattels
is to be put out at Common or Lawfull Interest for the Benefit of my afore-
named Children; and my wife to have her part of my said Estate when she
pleases to demand it of The Executors of This my Last Will and Testament.

and my aforementioned Children to have their Share or part delivered to them as they arrive to the age of one and Twenty years my daughter Ann only excepted, who shall have her part or Dividen delivered to her at the day of her lawfull marriage but if it should please God take out of this world any of my aforementioned Children before they arrive at the age of Twenty One years or has a lawfull heir lawfully begotten of their Body Then that Childs share that happens to dye or any of them that should happen to dye to be equally divided amongst the Surviving Children, and my beloved Wife Mary but if in case all my aforesaid Children should dye before they arrive to the age of Twenty one years or has an heir lawfully begotten of their Body Then my will is that five Hundred Pounds be paid and given to Mr. Richard Capers of Christ Church Parish, and the use of the remainder of my Childrens estate to be for my loving wife Mary

I make and ordain my loving wife Executrix, Mr. Richard Capers and George Oliver both of Christ Church parish Exors. of this my last will & Testament In Witness whereof the said Charvil Wingood have to this my last Will & Testament set my hand and seal the day and year above written

Signed Sealed and delivered by the said Charvil Wingood as and for his last Will and Testament in the presence of us in the fourth Line upward from the Signing and in the Sixth Line and Seventh Line some scratches with the pen before the signing and publishing of this Will.
