South Carolina By Virtue of a Decimus under the hand and Seal of the hon^{ble} William Bull Esq^r Chief Governor and ordinary of this Province to me directed appeared John Smith and Susannah Bond two of the subscribing Witnesses to the within Will who being duly sworn declared they saw Joseph Maybanck sign Seal Published Pronounced and Declare the within to be his last Will and Testament that he was then of Sound and disposing Mind Memory and Understanding that they signed their names as Witnesses thereto in the Testators Presence and that they saw Sam^l Higfall the other subscribing Witness do the same.

I Edward North of St Pauls Parish being weak in Body but of perfect mind and memory Do make and constitute this to be my last Will and Testament

First & Principally I Give my Soul to Almighty God who gave it me, my Body to be decently buried hoping at the day of Resurrection it will receive a Gracious Canon and that my gracious God, and Blessed Saviour will have mercy on it.

Item I will and Bequeath to my Loving Wife Calce North as her full Share and Dowry out of my Estate one Negro Wench named Gady and her Increase One Child Named Daphney One horse which she please, and Saddle, Two Cows and Calves, one Tea Kettle and half the Churn Two Dishes and Six Plates, Six knives and forks, one Bed and Furniture, one dressing Glass and her Board in my house if she continues a Widow till the last day of January 1747, and one hundred and eighty Pounds a year paid her to find her and her Children in liquor tea and Sugar and Cloaths till the last day of January 1747. But if she marries this one hundred and eighty pounds a year is void and to have it no longer also her Board in my house, But if she will take the Children with her to her husbands house and carefully maintain them then the one hundred and eighty Pounds a year shall continue till the above mentioned time, and then I farther Give her Eight hundred pounds South Carolina Currency and five years after that which will be in the year 1752, I Give her two hundred Pounds more and if she is not married in 1747, but continues my Chast Widow I Give her two Rooms upstairs in my house as long as she continues so and a Boy named Flander

Item I Give to my Daughter Susannah North and to my Son William Edge North and to the rest of my present Wifes Children if she has any by me, All them to stand on the head of Ashepoo River where my Cowpen is now, one in my name

636 acres one in the name of Benjamin Beape 411 acres to be equally divided betwixt them when Susannah North comes to the age of twenty one years old, but none of my Children are to have their share of Lands till they come to the age of twenty one years old. And at the age of twenty one years old I Give to Susannah North and William Beape North and to all the Children which I have already born or shall be born to me by this present Wife Ealse North two hundred and fifty pounds proclamation money to be paid to each child as they shall arrive to the age of twenty one years old, and for their support of bringing up in the world for the year above mentioned January the 31st 1747 to the age of twenty one each Child shall have the Interest of Two hundred and fifty pounds proclamation money at the rate of ten p b^r and then his or her two hundred and fifty pounds paid to them with their share of Land. But if all these Children dye without Issue then I Give these lands to John Edward and Elizabeth North and further I Give to my daughter Susannah North one negro wench named Ly and one young two year old Mare and one bow and ball and to my son William Beape North I Give one negro Girl named Phillis and one young Mare and one bow and ball this to be given at my death also out of the Childrens Interest money the taxes and Quit rents of their Lands must be paid.

Item I Give to my Daughter Elizabeth North at the day of my death four negroes Bristol Frank and Flora and Charlott and all her Children if she has any and one Bed and Furniture one horse and saddle and all the horses and Battle that is known to be called hers And I further give her Two thousand Pounds South Carolina Currency to be paid to her the 31st day of January 1747.

Item I Give to my Son Edward North all my Lands and houses on the east side of Con Con River and the Negro Boy named Matthew and all the horses and Battle that is called his.

Item I Give unto my Son John North all my Lands and houses which is not already given on the West side of Con Con River on or near the horse shoe Savanna and one negro boy named Beager and his Negro Man named Adam and all the Battle and horses that is known by his name.

Item I further Give to my two Sons Edward North to be equally divided betwixt them the 31st day of January which will be in the year of our Lord 1747 all my real and personal Estate which is not already given away and I desire my Sons and Executors to give to Mr Edward Perry all my wearing apparell and a Gold Ring a Scarff hatband and Gloves and to his Wife a Scarf Gloves and Ring and to my Wife and all my Children Scarves Gloves and Rings and mourning if needfull, and to every man that is in my employment at my Death I Give a hatt and a pair of gloves and a Ring of Seven Pounds Value the Possie to be remember the giver **EN** and the day and date and to their Wives Scarfs Gloves and Ring and I desire to be carried to the Grave by these men and I fully empower my Executors and Sons to sell anything out of my estate except Negroes or Lands to pay my Just Debts, and to clear what lands they please to work my Negroes on, or to lease what Land they please for any term not exceeding five years from the date hereof I desire a brick Wall may be built round our Graves and a Reader Post to be put at the head of each Grave with the name and age of each person on it.

Item I constitute and appoint to this my last Will and Testament as my Executors to be disposed of my Real and personal Estate as is above mentioned my well beloved friend Mr Edward Perry and my two beloved Sons John and Edward North whom I fully empower to act and do according to the true intent and meaning of this my last Will and Testament and I do hereby utterly disallow revoke and Disannul all other Will and Testaments whatsoever whereas I have hitherto set my hand & seal this 3^d day of April 1743.

Northcott Webster James Pratt and Mary Webster (three of the subscribing Witnesses to the within Will) appeared before me who being duly sworn declared that they were present and did see Edward North sign Seal Publish pronounce and declare the foregoing to be his last Will & Testament that he was then of sound and disposing mind Memory & understanding to their belief and also that John Stewart and Elizabeth McEord the other subscribing Witnesses did sign their names together with them in the Testators Presence also swore John North one of the Executors to execute the said Will this 5th October 1743.

Imprimis I Give Devise and Bequeath to my beloved Wife Elizabeth & to her heirs and assigns for ever one negro man named London one Woman named Phillis and her increase my best horse side Saddle & its furniture my best Bed and its furniture also six Bowes and Balves six Chairs my best looking Glass and my best Chest and Table all to be delivered to her immediately after my decease & also that she live on my Plantation & be maintained with my other Children out of the profits thereof during her natural life or untill my Son Stephen attain the age of twenty one years I Give and Bequeath unto my daughter Mary Westbury Two hundred and fifty
