 said Town & Province Gent dec^d for divers good causes & considerations me hereunto moving
 have Promised Renounced Disclaimed and refused. And by these presents Do Remise,
 Announce Disclaim & refuse to take upon me the burthen or Execution of the said Will and
 Testament or the Administration of the goods & Chattels Rights and Credits of the said de-
 ceased, to the end that the Execution of the said Will & Testament and the administra-
 tion of the said goods & Chattels may be granted and committed unto Sarah Sloyd
 Widow & Relict of the said dec^d named Executrix in the said Will or otherwise as to the
 Ordinary shall seem fit and I do pray & desire the Governour & Ordinary of this Pro-
 vince to admit this my Letter of Renunciation to be recorded & that I may be Excused
 from Acting as Executor of the said Will And further do by these Presents make
 Constitute & Appoint one or more Proctor or Proctors to confess & Admit of this my Act of
 Renunciation (if the same shall be desired or required)

 in the Province of South Carolina Planter finding myself very Sick and weak in body
 but of perfect mind & memory thanks be to Almighty God therefore calling to mind the
 mortality of my Body and knowing that it is appointed for all men once to die Do
 make & Ordain this my Last Will and Testament that is to say
 Principally of first of all I give and recommend my Soul into the hands of God that gave it and my
 Body I recommend to the Earth to be buried in a decent manner at the Discretion of
 my Executors nothing doubting but at the General Resurrection I shall receive the
 same again by the mighty power of Almighty God and as touching such worldly
 Estate wherewith it hath pleased God to Bless me with in this Life I give devise
 and dispose of the same in the following manner and form
 It is my Will and pleasure that all my Book Debts Notes and Bonds ~~that~~
 all called in and the Crop that is upon the Ground with the goods that I have unsold
 to be sold to pay my Chauffull Debts and that my Estate be kept together till my
 Debts be paid and the rest I give as followeth

I give and bequeath to my dear and well beloved Wife Jane Campbell One Negro
 man named Jack and one Negro Woman named Amah and her Child named Jenny

Two horses Two Mares & Eight head of Cattle and all the household furniture and Plantations
Tools & moveable goods.

Item I give to my beloved Daughter Elizabeth Campbell One Negro named Will a young
Male on James Island branded R thus an old Side Saddle and one red Cow and calf
with their Increase

Item I give to my beloved Son Timothy One Negro named Tom a Mare Colt and Increase
and one Cow with a white Spot in the flank & her calf with their Increase and it is my desire
that the Executors of this Will & good will to put my son Timothy Apprentice to a
Convenient Trade as they shall think proper and at the End of this Apprenticeship
the aforesaid things to be delivered to him

Item I give to my Young Daughter Ann One Negro named Friday and a young Negro
Girl called Kate a mouse Coloured Cow and calf with their Increase I likewise Con-
stitute make and Ordain to be my Executors to this my Last Will and Testament my
Beloved Wife Jane Campbell and Elizabeth Campbell my daughter to be Executrices and
Mr Robert Cole Executor And I do hereby utterly Disallow revoke and disannul
all and every other former Testaments Wills Legacies and Bequests and Executors
by me in any wise before named Willed and Bequeathed Ratifying this and no other
to be my Last Will and Testament.

and Testament in manner and form following to wit

I Commit my Soul into the hands of Almighty God and my Body to the Earth
to be buried in a decent manner, hoping through the satisfaction and Righteousness
of Christ my Redeemer to be made Partaker of Etern^l. happiness: and for my Mortal
Estate I dispose of it as follows.

Imprimis
Item my Will is that all my Debts and Funeral Expenses shall be first discharged
I Give and devise to my Belov^d Wife Hannah Broughton, my House and Planta-
tion of Seaton as long as she shall remain sole and unmarried without Imprac-
tment of Waste Subject Nevertheless to the Incumbrances hereafter Imposed and upon
Condition that she shall Relinquish and Release to Stafford Plantation, and
