The Twenty eighth day of February in the year of our Lord One thousand seven hundred and forty two,

I James Simpson of St Georges Parish in Berkeley County and Province of South Carolina Planter being in good and perfect health as well as of sound mind and memory thanks be to Almighty God therefore But calling to mind the shortness and uncertainty of this mortal life and that is appointed for all men once to die do make constitute and appoint this my last Will and Testament revoking and renouncing and by these presents do revoke renounce disannull and make void all manner of former wills testaments gifts bequests and legacies whatsoever thereto by me made or appointed Declaring and pronouncing this and this only to be my last Will and Testament that is to say principally and first of all I give Bequeath and Recommend my soul into the hands of Almighty God who gave it and my body I recommend unto the Earth to be buried in such decent and Christian manner as it shall please my Executor hereafter named to appoint

such Temporal Estate as it hath pleased God Of his goodness (or Beyond my Deserts) to bestow upon me

I do make and Dispose of the same in manner and form following

My Will is that in the first place all such Lawfull Debts and Dem^s which I have due to any person

or persons be fully discharged and paid by my Executors hereafter named.

Item I give and bequeath to my well Beloved Son William Simpson my whole Estate real and Personal with
every part and parcel thereof to him his heirs and assigns forever.

Item my will is that in case my Executors hereafter named Should Either be creditably informed of my Death
or have no certain account dari from me During the Space of one whole year after the date hereof my will is
that then in such case they Expose my whole Estate to Public Sale (or otherwise as they shall see most advantagous)
and the Money arising therefrom be Set out to Interest till my said Son arrive to the age of twenty one
years at which age my will is that he be put in full possession of the same as also of the Interest or profit arising
therefrom.

Item my will is that in case my said Son Should die before he arrive to the age of Twenty one years or have
Issue of his Body lawfully Begotten that then my said Estate both real and personal with every
part and parcel thereof be given unto my well beloved Brother Thomas Simpson now residing in Bent
County in the province of Mireland to him his heirs and assigns forever.

Item my will is that my said Son as soon as he is Capable of Learning be put to School and intrusted or
taught to read write and Decypher as far (at least) as through all the brenchrs of the Golden Rule and
that at the age of fourteen years he be sent or bound an apprentice to some honest ana soberman to
learn the trade craft of a Carpenter and Joiner for the space of six years and at the Expiration thereof
that he be put a year to School to improve his Learning.

Item I do hereby constitute and appoint my well beloved friends Thomas Simpson Robert Russ and
Henry Wood to be the sole Execs of this my last Will and Testament and of all and every preceit
Article and Clause therof Revoking Renouncing and Disannulling asaforsaid all and every
other or former Execs will or wills Declaring and Pronouncing asaforsaid this ana this only to be
my last Will and Testament In Witness Whereof I have hereunto Set my hand and Seal the
Day and year first above Written.
