I give grant and bequeath unto the Presbyterian congregation at Willtown the sum of one hundred Pounds Current Money of the said Province, Towards the future support of a Presbyterian Minister in that Congregation.

Item

I give grant & Bequeath a Mourning ring unto each of my two sons James & William Stobo

Item

I give grant and bequeath a Mourning ring unto each of my two Daughters Jean Bulloch and Elizabeth Stanyarne

Item

I give grant and Bequeath a Mourning ring unto each of my two Sons in Law James Bulloch and Joseph Stanyarne.

Item

I give grant and Bequeath a Mourning ring unto my Daughter in Law Elizabeth Stobo

Item

I give grant and Bequeath unto my Loving Wife Elizabeth Stobo, her Heirs, Executors, Admors and Assigns; the whole and full remainder of my Personal Estate; together with the whole and all of my Real Estate. hereby constituting ordaining and appointing her my Beloved wife together with my two sons James & William Stobo's Executors of this my last Will and Testament; and hereby revoking & annulling all other and former Last Wills and Testaments by me made. In Witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal this Twenty fifth day of February 1735/6

I Joanna Sumner of St Pauls Parish & Colleton County (being in a weak and low estate of health but of perfect mind and Memory) calling to mind my Mortallity & knowing that it is appointed for all men once to dye, do make and Establish this my last will and Testament in manner and form following

Imprimis

my Body I give to the Earth to be buried with a decent and Christian like Burial, and my Soul I commit into the hands of God That gave it.

Item

My Lawfull Debts and Funeral Charges being paid I will that my well Beloved Daughter Susanna Sumner shall have in View of her former Dowry or part of her deceased Father Joseph Sumners Estate one Feather Bed with a Bouldster and two Pillows one pair of Sheets, Tugg and Blankett two Large Dishes four Plates a Couch a

Small Iron pot and a warming Pan, one Cow and two Calves one of them a year
ling, one male Slave named Pompey one Nench named Uonaaga with her two Children
Itus and Scipor and a Negro Girl named Philis; out of which above mentioned Lega-
cy I will that she shall pay to my Grand Children hereafter mentioned as they come of
age the sum of Forty Pounds Currency to be equally divided amongst them viz Thomas,
John and William Graves the sons of Moses and Sarah Graves deceased John Ann and
Elizabeth Eliot the Children of William Elliot deceased and Elizabeth and Sarah Carr
the Children of John Baker deceased. I will also that if she the said Susanna Summer
die without any lawful Issue of her Body that then the above Legacy shall be appriz'd
and the overplus of her former dower or part of her abovesaid Father's Estate shall return
to be equally divided amongst my surviving Children.

Item I will that the rest of my Estate Goods and Chattels be appraised and equally
divided amongst my Children here mentioned viz my well beloved Daughters
Elizabeth and Marsey Quarterman and my well beloved Son William Baker I
will also that he the said William Baker shall have my Indian Man Noro for a
part of his Share and in case he should be valued at more than what shall be account-
ed his the abovesaid William Baker's part of my abovementioned Estate to be divided
amongst my three last mentioned Children, that then he the said William Baker
shall pay the Overplus to my two last mentioned Daughters.

Item I will that Ten pounds Currency be paid out of that part of my Estate which is to be
divided amongst my two last mentioned Daughters and my Son William Baker to be
equally divided among my abovesaid Grand Children, the same to be paid to them as they come
of age.

Item I constitute ordain & appoint, my well beloved Son in Law John Quarterman
and my well beloved Son William Baker with my well beloved Daughters Marsey
Quarterman and Susanna Summer the sole Executors and Executrixs of this my
Last Will and Testament hereby disallowing disapproving disannulling and
making void all other Wills Testaments or Legacies whatsoever by me heretofore
made, Ratifying Confirming this and no other to be my Last will and Testa-
ment, as witness my hand This Twenty first day of February in the year of our
Lord one Thousand Seven hundred and forty alis forty one.

I bequeath my Soul into the hands of Almighty God hoping and believing a Pardon of my Sins by the Merits and Mediation of Jesus Christ and my Body I Commit to the Earth to be buried at the Discretion of my Executors hereinafter named.

I Will that all my just Debts and funeral Charges be first paid & discharged.

I Give and Bequeath to my very good friend Capt. Adam Beauchamp of Charles Town Gent. a long silver Spoon with a Grater at the end of it; one Silver Ringer with a Cover two pair of Gold Sleeve Buttons, half a Dozen Knives and forks with Silver handles, and one Dozen China Plates also one Clock now in the Possession of Mr. William Cattell provided that the said Adam Beauchamp do pay and satisfy the said Mr. W^m Cattell all his just and reasonable Charges for mending & cleaning the said Clock To have and to hold the said Premises to him and his Heirs forever. I Give and Bequeath all the rest and Residue of my Estate of what sort soever to Mr. Peter Jeyes of Charles Town in the Province aforesaid To have and to hold the same to him and his Heirs forever.

I do hereby Constitute Nominate and Appoint the said Capt. Adam Beauchamp and Peter Jeyes Executors of this my last Will and Testament etc. Witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and Seal This Seventeenth Day of November In the year of our Lord one Thousand Seven Hundred & forty one.
