I give unto my Daughter Martha Sealy Seven hundred Pounds in money to be paid at the age of Seventeen years as money is now.
I give unto my Daughter Hanna Sealy one Negro Girl Called Venus and five Hundred pounds in money at the age of Seventeen years as money is now.
I give unto my Daughter Marget Sealy one Negro Girl Called Coker and five Hundred Pounds in money to be paid at the age of Seventeen years as money is now.
I leave my wife Hannah Sealy all my whole Estate and she is to bring up the Children until they come of Age Paying all Dues Debts Incapies and Funerall Charges out of the Estate and at her Death the whole Estate to be Equally Divided between my three Sons William Sealy John Sealy, Mixel Sealy.
