In the name of God Amen. the Twenty sixth day of March
 in the year of our Lord God one thousand seven hundred and forty
 I John Wilson of Wadmalaw Island in Colleton County South
 Carolina Plaintiff being very sick and weak in Body but in

perfect mind and memory thanks be given to God, therefore calling unto mind the Mortality of my Body and knowing that it is appointed for all men once to dye Do make and ordain this my Last Will and Testament (that is to say) principally and first of all I give and Recommend my Soul into the hand of God that giveth and my Body I Recommend it to the Earth, to be buried in a Christian like manner at the Discretion of my Executors nothing doubting but at the General Resurrection I shall receive the same again by the mighty Power of God and as Touching such worldly Estate wherewith it has pleased God to bless me with in this life I give Bequeath and dispose of the same in the following manner and form.

I Give and Bequeath unto my Beloved Son, Hugh Wilson, my dwelling House and half my Tract of Land to be taken from the South End, with me feather Bed and furniture and Six Silver Tea Spoons and Trays and half my Tract of Land at Williamsburgh and to have Liberty to cut and make use of Timber from of my Son John Wilsons Pine Barren, that Joins himself in fencing but not to waste the said Timber to be by him freely possessed and enjoyed.

I Give and Bequeath to my Beloved Son John Wilson the other half of my Tract of Land to be taken of the North End and to have the Liberty to cut what Cypress Timber he shall want out of my Son Hugh Wilsons Cypress Swamp for his own building with half my Tract of Land at Williamsburgh to be by him freely possessed and enjoyed.

I Give my Son Hugh Wilson leave to clear Twenty Acres of Land that Joins Coll: Watts Dam and to hold on till my Debts are defraide.

My Will is that my Estate do pay yearly to a Minister that does Conform to the Kirk of Scotland and hath a lawfull call to the Meeting House, at the head of Bokhucett, Twenty pounds per year, my son Hugh Wilsons Estate to pay Twelve pounds for ever to the Minister that shall be called as aforesaid, and my Son John Wilsons Estate to pay Twelve pounds for ever to the minister that shall be called as aforesaid.

My Will is after my lawfull Debts are defraide that one Negro Boy be bought and given to my beloved Anaman James Wilson, to the value of One hundred and Twenty pounds this Currency.

My Will is that my Negroes are kept together as they are untill my lawfull Debts and Funeral Charges are defraide.

My Will is that my son John Wilson have Six months Schooling and that he be kept to his Trade till of Age And that he have Thirty pounds allowed him to begin his Trade with, and that the House at the Landing be kept in good Repair for him till he Come of age.

My Will is that my Slaves are divided as follows, my Son Hugh Wilson, to have Cughe, Cleo, Cesar, Jack, Dick, Vinah, Hegah, Samson, Son, Maph, Swaphin, Sonon, my Son John Wilson to have Centey, Son, Sambo, July, Mill, Adam, Dick, Phillis, Belloe, Jacob, Sgrah.

My Will is that the Negro Boy called Prime be sold as my Sons Hugh and John Wilson shall think best, the value is Two hundred pounds this Currency.

My Will is that all plantation Tools be not shared till my Sons divide their Slaves and then them to have them Equally Divided between my two Sons Hugh and John Wilson as axes horse Pots Cart and three Yoke of Oxen, Sinding Mill and Mortar wind fan and so forth.

My Will is that the rest of my personal Estate be Equally Divided between my two Sons Hugh and John Wilson and that my Son John Wilsons part be sold at Public Vendue to the highest bidder and the money laid out as my Executors hereafter named shall think best for his Interest.

I likewise constitute make and ordain my Son Hugh Wilson Thomas Gadson, William Ferguson, Richard Pursell, Robert Turner Executors to this my last Will and Testament, and if any of these Executors shall die then the surviving Exors. shall choose another, Instead of the Deceased.

And I do hereby utterly Disallow Revoke and Disannul all and every other former Will or Wills Legacies Requests and Exors by me in any ways before this Time named, Ratifying and Confirming this and no other to be last Will and Testament, In Witness whereof I have hereunto Set my hand and Seal the day and year above written.
