And lastly the remainder I give to my well beloved friends Will^m Scriven and William Elliott whom I likewise constitute make and ordain my Executors of this my last Will and Testament all and Singular my Lands Messuages and Tenements by them freely to be possessed with all my other goods and Chattles to be equally Divided between them And I do hereby utterly disallow, revoke and disannull all and every other former Testaments, Wills, Legacies and bequests and Executors by me in any wayes before named, Made and Bequeathed, Ratifying and confirming this and no other to be my last Will and Testament In witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and Seal the day & Year above written.
