for the good will and affection I do Bear unto my two Beloved Daughters, I do give unto them named, Margaret and Mary all my Estate, to be equilly Devided among them, and if one of my Daughter should die, before marry or arrive unto the age of Eighteen years, will that one Lives Shall inherit of the Deads Estate.

Do Nominate and constitute and ordain James Boisseau and Louis Calmarin Executors of this my last Will and Testament. In Witness Whereof I do acknowledge this one Sheet of Paper to be my last Will and Testament and herunto sets my hand and Seal this 12 Day of July 1743.
