Peter Sieubrey of the Parish of Grace Frederick Ninewa of Brown County in the province of South Carolina Planter, Being in good judgement Do my Last Will and Testament as followeth,

First

I Recommend my Soul to God my Creator, beseech him that by the Merit of his infinite Son Jesus Christ, my Saviour to receive me in his Celestial Kingdom and as touching and Disposing of all my Temporal Estate, as it hath pleased God to bestow on me, I Give and dispose thereof as followeth

First

I will that all my Debts be paid by my Executors hereafter named.

Item

I Do give to my Wife Sophia one shilling Sterling and no more and as I am partner with Alexander Dupont, I will that the partnership shall finish intirely.

Item

I Give unto my Daughter Margaret, one of my Negro Woman Named Nane,

Item

I Will that all my Estate shall be sold and the Money to be putt att interest and the interest of my Estate money will be for the Maintenance of my two Daughters, till they Marry or arrive unto the age of Eighteen years of age, then they shall receive their principall portion paid by my Executors.

Item

for the good will and affection I do Bear unto my two Beloved Daughters, I do give unto them, named Margaret and Mary all my Estate to be equally Divided among them, and if one of my Daughter should die, before marry or arrive unto the age of Eighteen years, I will that one of my Sires shall inherit of the Deads Estate.

Item

I Do Nominate appoint constitute and ordain James Boisseau and Louis Calmarin Executors of this my Last Will and Testament. In Witness Whereof I do acknowledge this one Sheet of Paper to be my Last Will and Testament and hereunto set my hand and Seal this 12 Day of July 1742.
