Imprimis Will and Order that all my just Debts and funeral Charges be paid in convenient time after my Decease.
I Give and bequeath unto my loving sister Willoughby Harbert the sum of Two

hundred Pounds Current money, And I also give and bequeath unto my said Sister her Heirs and Assigns all my Estate, Right, Title and Interest of and in the Plantation in St James Goose Creek containing Five hundred Acres of Land more or less on which my Father lived and which was or now is in the Possession of my said Sister, And I also give to my said sister two Negroes named Gudio and Tony.

Item I Give and bequeath to my Sister Margaret Brown the sum of Two hundred pounds Curr^t money.

Item I Give and bequeath unto my Sister Elizabeth Herbert the Sum of Two hundred Pounds Current money.

Item I Give and Bequeath unto my Sister Mary Herbert Two hundred Pounds Current Money.

Item I Give & Bequeath unto my honoured Aunt Mrs. Mary Goddard one hundred and fifty Pounds Currant money.

Item I Give and bequeath all the Residue and Remaining part of my Estate both Real and Personal which I am anyway Seized or Possessed of Interested in or Intitled unto, to my Dear Brother Samuel Herbert his Heirs Exors and Admors and Assigns for ever.

Item my Will is that the Several Money Legacies above mentioned shall be paid by my Executors within four year next after my Decease out of the Produce of my Estate or sooner if the same shall be sooner made from the said Produce and Profits of my said Estate.

And Lastly I do hereby nominate and appoint my Loving Friend Mr. George Hunter and my said sister Willoughby Herbert to be Executors and Exor of this my last Will and Testament hereby Revoking and making Void and Null all former and other Wills by me heretofore made Declaring these Presents to be and contain my Last Will and Testament In Witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal the Day and Year abovesaid.
