I Will that all my Estate shall be sold and the Money to be putt att interest and the interest of my Estate money to be for the Maintinance of my two Daughters, till they Marry or arrive unto the age of Eighteen years of age, then they shall receive their principall porsion paid by my Executors.

for the good will and affection I do bear unto my two Beloved Daughters, I do give unto them, named Margaret and Mary all my Estate, to be equilly Divided among them, and if one of my Daughter should die, before marry or arrive into the age of Eighteen years, I will that one Give shall inherit of the Deads Estate.

Item

I Do Nominate appoint constitute and ordain James Boisseau and Louis Calmarin Executors of this my Last Will and Testament, In Witness Whereof I do acknowledge this one Sheet of Paper to be my Last Will and Testament and hereunto set my hand and seal this 12th Day of July 1742.
