Item I make and ordain the said Robert Stevens to be my full whole and only Executor of this my Last Will Testament
and do utterly Revoke all Wills and Testaments by me in anywise heretofore made.

same as their Right and Property and to Dispose of the same as they shall think proper And I hereby revoke
all other Wills & Testaments by me heretofore made And ordaining this to be my Last Will & Testament.

for the good will and affection I do Bear unto my two Beloved Daughters, I do give unto them, named Margaret and
 Mary all my Estate to be equally Divided among them, and if one of my Daughter should die, before marry or arrive
 unto the age of Eighteen years, I will that one Sives shall inherit of the Deads Estate.

Item

I Do Nominate appoint constitute and ordain James Boisseau and Louis Calmarin Executors of this my Last
 Will and Testament. In Witness Whereof I do acknowledge this one Sheet of Paper to be my Last Will and Testament
 and hereunto set my hand and Seal this 12 Day of July 1742.
