I William Mc Gillivray being sick and near in Body but of sound and perfect memory blessed be God for the same, do order and Dispose of all my Worldly Estate that God has left me with in manner and form following
I give and Bequeath all my Lands with all the Privileges, Tenements belong-
my unto my Two Sons Alexander and Robert Mc Gillivray to be equally divided between them at the time hereafter named together with four of Choicest of my Slaves to be Equally divided at the same time that is to say whenever my Son Alexander arrive at the age of Twenty years then one half of Land and Two of my best Slaves after my Executors hereafter named, hath Divided them be delivered by them to him and after such Division and Delivery made that then the same Executors shall manage the rest of my Estate in the behalf of other children for their benefit till the Expiration of the times hereafter named that is whenever my Son Robert attain to the age of Twenty years that then the other half of my Land with Two of my Best Slaves be delivered by my Executors to my Son Robert, and all the rest of my real and personal Estate to be Equally between my the children as followeth - Alexander Robert Incredia Elizabeth Susannah and Sosiahe Mc Gillivray and further my Will is that all my Estate may be kept together till the times above mentioned is Expired and that my Executors shall pay all my Lawfull Debts Dues and Demands out of my Estate and further my will is my loving wife Elizabeth Mc Gillivray shall have her abode on and maintenance on my Plantation during her widowhood and no longer.

I give unto my Mary Norris one Shilling Sterling and further my will and desire is that my Trust friends Robert Sams and Jonathan Thomas may be Executors and Elizabeth Mc Gillivray my wife to be my Executrix and desire that they may pay to my Son in Law Patrick Norris one hundred and fifty pounds Carolina Currency at the end of four years or whenever my lawfull Debts are discharged that are due at my decease and this I acknowledge to be my last Will & Testament Entirely Revoking and Renouncing all former wills by me made In Witness whereof I the said Wm Mc Gillivray have hereunto set my hand and Seal this Twenty first day of January in the year of our Lord one thousand seven hundred and thirty eight nine

I give and bequeath unto my beloved nephew John McCall the sum of one hundred pounds like money, one silver Easter, one little Chest, one pair of Gold Shoon Buttons, one gold ring, one Negro Girl Slave named Hannah, to him his Exors, Admors & Assigns for ever.

I give and bequeath unto my beloved Niece Mary Portwint the sum of fifty pounds like Current money for mourning and one Pistole to be made into a ring.

Item

I give and bequeath unto my beloved Niece Mary Chapman the sum of fifty pounds like money for mourning, and one Silver Snuff box.

Item

I give and bequeath unto my beloved Nephew Christopher Guy the sum of one hundred pounds like money, and one gold ring marked N. N.

Item

I give and bequeath unto my beloved Nephew William Guy the sum of fifty pounds like money.

Item

I give and bequeath unto my beloved Nephew Charles Guy the sum of one hundred pounds like money.

Item

I give and bequeath unto my beloved Niece Rebecca Guy Jun. the sum of fifty pounds like money and my gold Lockett.

I give and bequeath unto my beloved Niece Jean Guy the sum of fifty pounds like money.
