Item I give to each of my Executors hereafter named the sum of Fifty Pounds Current money apiece.

Item I give devise and bequeath the use, Occupation, rents, Issues, and Profits thereof unto my aforesaid Wife Lemimah Skene for and during the term of her Natural life and from and immediately after her Decease, I give devise and bequeath the same unto my Grandson Alexander Skene, and to the Heirs of his body lawfully begotten but if it shall happen that the said Alex^r Skene shall Die before he attains his age of Twenty one years, without Heirs of his body lawfully begotten, that then all my said Estate both real and Personal shall remain to my said son John Skene and his Right Heirs forever.

Lastly I do constitute and appoint my Tender and dearly beloved Wife Lemimah Skene Executrix and my Good Friends The Honble Joseph Blake Esq^r William Battell and Benjamin Whitaker Esq^r Executors of this my Last Will and Testament. In Witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and Seal to this my Will contained in two Sheets of Paper on this 25th day of May in the year of our Lord one thousand seven hundred and thirty nine. I William Sanders of the Parish of St Thomas in Berkley County in the Province of South Carolina Planter, being Sick and Weak in Body but of sound and perfect mind and memory thanks be to Almighty God for the same, and knowing that it is appointed for all men to dye do make and ordain my Last will and Testament in manner following (that is to say) first and principally I commend my Soul into the hands of Almighty God hoping through the merits of my Lord and Saviour Jesus Christ to have full and free Pardon and forgiveness of all my sins and to Inherit Everlasting Life and my

body I commit to the Earth to be Decently buried at the Discretion of my Executors hereafter named, and as touching the disposition of all such Temporal Estate wherewith it hath pleased Almighty God to bestow upon me I give and Dispose thereof in manner following (that is to say)

- Item I Will that all my just Debts and funeral Charges be first paid and Discharged.
- Item it is my Will that all my Estate both real & Personall be sold at Publick Sale by my Executors as soon as the Crop can be cleaned that shall be in the Ground at the time of my Decease.
- Item I give devise and bequeath unto my Nephew William Sanders son of my brother John Sanders the sum of one Thousand pounds Currant money to be put out at Interest and paid him at his age of twenty one years,
- Item I give devise and bequeath unto Neice Mary Sanders daughter of my said brother John the sum of One Thousand pounds Current money to be put out at Interest, and paid her at her respective age of twenty one years, and in case either my said Nephew William or my said Neice Mary should happen to dye before their respective ages of Twenty one years then and in such case I will that the Survivor of them shall have the said sum of One Thousand Pounds and Interest of him or her so deceasing.
- Item I give devise and bequeath unto my Brother John Sanders the sum of Five hundred pounds Current money to be paid by my Executors within Twelve months after my Decease.
- Item I give devise and bequeath unto my Nephew John Sanders son of my said Brother John, my Neice Sarah daughter of the said John Sanders and my Neice Ann Sanders daughter of my said brother John, and to my Neice Patience daughter of my said brother John, and to my Neice Hannah Sanders Daughter of my said Brother John to each and every of them the sum of Five hundred pounds Current money to be put out at Interest by my Executors and paid them at their respective ages of Twenty one years and in case the said John Sanders, Sarah Sanders, Ann Sanders, Patience Sanders and Hannah Sanders or any or either of them should happen to Dye, before their respective ages of twenty one years, then it is my will that the Legacy of them or any of them so dying shall be equally Shared amongst the Survivors and paid at the Ages of Twenty one years as aforesaid.
- Item I give and bequeath unto my brother Joseph the sum of Three Hundred Pounds Current money to be paid within Twelve Months after my Decease.
- Item I give and bequeath unto my Nephews Joseph and Thomas Sanders sons of my said Brother Joseph to each of them the sum of One Hundred Pounds Currant money to be put at Interest and paid them at their respective ages of Twenty one years and in case one should die his Share so Dying to go to the Survivor.
- Item I give devise and Bequeath unto Old Mrs. Dehay the sum of Twenty Pounds Currancy.
- Item I give and bequeath unto Mr. Sasur Widow the sum of Twenty Pounds Currancy.
- Item I give devise unto my Godson Charles Scanlon the sum of Twenty Pounds Currancy.
- Item I give and bequeath unto my Cousin Capt. Stephen Fogartie the sum of Two hundred pounds currancy.
- Item I give and bequeath unto Mrs. Mary Ford the sum of One hundred and Twenty Pounds Currant money.
- Item I give and bequeath unto my brothers John and Joseph Sanders all my Wearing apparel both Woolen and Linnen to be equally divided between them.
