Prince,
- Item I give and bequeath to my Son Dinis, all that Tract of Land containing
Three hundred and fifty acres, which was granted to me the fourteenth
day of February 1735, I give and Bequeath to my Son Florence all that
Tract of Land containing One hundred acres which was granted to me
the Twenty third day of May 1734
- Item I give and bequeath to my Daughter Sarah four negroes named Hector,
Bido, Scason and Jack to her and the heirs of her Body for ever
- Item I give and bequeath to my Son Dinis four negroes named, Will,
Gady, hana, and Samson to him and the heirs of his Body, for ever.
- Item I give and bequeath unto my Daughter Mary four negroes named
Philis Belfast Coffey and Jo, to her and the heirs of her Body, for ever
- Item I give and bequeath unto my Son Florence five negroes named Dublin,
March, peter, Simon and purtina to him and the heirs of his Body for ever.
- Item all the rest of my moveables to be Divided among my four Children to-
gether with Cattle Mares and horses. if any of my children should
dye before they Beget children or heirs of their Bodys that their part
shall Return back to the rest of my children to be Equally Divided
amongst them.
- Item I give and bequeath unto my Son Dinis my Buckels
- Item I give and Bequeath to my Son Florence my Gould Buttons
- I constitute and appoint my loving wife Mary my daughter Sarah
my Son Dinis my Daughter Mary and my Son Florence to be
Executors of this my last Will and Testament In Witness whereof
I sett my hand and fix my Seal the day and year above
written, Signed Sealed and delivered in presents of us this is my
last Will and Testament if any of these Negroes should dye that
another shall be bought in the Room thereof.

disposing mind and memory do make and declare this my

last will and Testament and do give and dispose of that Estate which it hath pleased God to Bless me with after payment of my Just Debts and Funeral charges, as followeth that is to say First I give and bequeath, to my Brother John Biggar Wallace Fifty pounds Sterling Also I give and bequeath to my worthy friend John Cleland Esquire Fifty pounds Sterling Also I give and Bequeath to Alexander Murray of Charles Town Merchant Sixty pounds Sterling Also I give and Bequeath to Anna Isabella Cleland Daughter of the said John Cleland my negro wench named Minnie and her three children Also my will is and I hereby declare the same that my Negro Boy Tom, shall be free within one month after my Death and I Devise him his freedom and liberty accordingly Also I give and Devise to Mistress Mary Cleland wife of the said John Cleland and to my Friend James Freeme of Charles Town Esquire one Suite of mourning aprice Also I give and Devise all the rest and residue of my Estate Real and personal whatsoever and wheresoever to my Brother Andrew Wallace and the heirs of his Body lawfully begotten and on default of such heirs of his Body I give and Devise the same unto my said Brother John Biggar Wallace and the said John Cleland Esquire their heirs Exors. and admors. forever Equally to be Divided between my said brother and the said John Cleland, share and share alike, I do hereby nominate constitute and appoint the said John Cleland James Freeme and Alexander Murray Executors of this my last Will and Testament hereby Revoking and making null and void all other Wills by me at any time heretofore made, and ----- Declaring this alone to be my last Will and Testament In Witness whereof I have set hereunto my hand and Seal at Charles Town in South Carolina this Twentieth Eighth day of May in the year of our Lord one thousand Seven hundred and Fifty one
