

Mother Elizabeth Verditty That then the said Elizabeth Verditty shall have hold & enjoy my said plantation named Milton with all the premises and Appurtenances thereunto belonging during all the days of her natural life Suspending the said devise unto my said Daughter of the said plantation Untill the death of the said Elizabeth Verditty From I give devise and Bequeath unto my said Daughter Joanna Broughton Monck all that the said six hundred Acres of Land Which I have already Settled upon her by Deed of Settlement to have & to hold the same unto my said Daugh- ter her Heirs & Assigns for ever From after all the Negro Slaves Which were Settled Upon my first Wife Joanna Monck by Deed of Settlement made before marriage & which devolve Upon my said Daughter are drawn of & divided agreeable to the direction of the said Settlement all the rest and residue of my Negro Slaves I do hereby Give Devise & bequeath unto my said Loving Wife Mary Monck & the Child she is now supposed to be with, to be equally divided between them their Executors Admors & Assigns Share & share alike But in Case my said Loving Wife Mary shall not Prove with Child or that the same shall not be Born alive in either of these Cases I do hereby Devise & Bequeath the said Residue of my Negro Slaves unto my said Loving Wife Mary & my said Daughter Joanna Broughton Monck to be Equally divided between them & to their Executors Admors & Assigns respectively share & share alike From I give & the Child she is now Broughton Monck all of Silver Candelsticks & Niggs and equi page to l and Assigns respectively or that the same shall not be said Plate & Watch I do hereby to be Equally Divided between respective Executors Admors & Assigns Snufflers Which were a present Joanna Broughton Monck her Executors Admors & Assigns From I give and Bequeath unto my said Loving Wife Mary Monck my Gold Watch named Elsworth Together with my Bain Sword Rings & Buckles & to her Executors Admors & Assigns for ever From it is my Will that in Case my Daughter

I Adam Beauchamp of Charles Town Gent being weak of Body but of Sound and disposing Memory & Understanding do make Publish & declare these Presents to be & contain my Last Will & Testament First & Principally I commend my Soul into the Hands of All righty God the Author & Giver of Life hoping for the free pardon & Remission of all my Sins in & through the Merits Death & Passion of my Lord & Saviour Jesus Christ my Body I give to the Earth to be decently Interred & as for my Worldly Estate I dispose thereof as follows - In primis I give & bequeath unto my Wife Elizabeth Beauchamp the sum of Four Thousand pounds money of the Province of S^c Carolina & if my said Wife is delivered of a Life Child in three Months after date - I give the said Child the sum of three Thousand Pounds money afo^r to be paid at Interest till it Comes of Age but if it dyes before that time then the said three Thousand pounds to be divided between my Brothers Children and him self Share & Share alike

I give & bequeath unto my Sister Margaret Chenevord of New England the sum of two Thousand pounds Money of the Province of S^c Carolina
 I give & Bequeath unto my Niece Margaret Shepard the Wife of William Shepard the sum of three Thousand Pounds Money of the Province of S^c Carolina together with Twelve Silver Spoons ~~two~~ Negroes trained - Bands and now in their Possession & March a Negro man Item all that my plantation situate lying & being in Portson County in the said Province I give & Bequeath unto Thomas Reid & Elizabeth S^c John his Sister to have & to Hold the same unto their their Heirs & Assigns for ever Item it is my Will that my Executors hereinafter named do sell & dispose of all the rest & Residue of my Real & Personal Estate which I do by these Presents give them Sufficient Power & Authority to do & the moneys arising from such Sale I do hereby give & Bequeath unto my Brother Isaac Beauchamp & his several Children to be equally divided between them share & share alike & to their Executors & Assigns Respectively & I do hereby - constitute and Appoint Gabriel Maniquelt George Hunter and William Shepard Executors of this my Last Will In Witness whereof I have hereunto set my Hand & Seal this twenty nine of December in the Year of Our Lord 1747

In the Name of God Amen, I Thomas Lovelass of Berkeley County in the Province of South Carolina Blacksmith being at Present in good Health & of a perfect mind & in many thanks be to God for the same do make & appoint my Last Will & Testament in manner following VIZ: First I bequeath my Soul into the Hands of Almighty God Who gave it & my Body I commit to the Earth to be decently Buried at the discretion of my Executors herein After named in hopes of a Joyfull Resurrection & to receive free pardon of all my Sins in & Through the Merits & Mediation of our Lord & Saviour Jesus Christ and as Touching such Worldly Estate wherewith it hath pleased God to bless me I give devise & dispose thereof in the manner following VIZ: Inprimis I will and desire that all my Just Debts and Funeral Charges be paid by my Executors hereafter named - Item I give devise & Bequeath unto my Will beloved Daughter Elizabeth Lovelass her maiden name but is married & now lives in Bucks County in Philadelphia by the Grate Swamp all my Estate both real & Personal of what Kind & Nature soever in this Province or else where which I shall dye possessed of or be Intituled to. to be by her possessed & Enjoyed by her her Heirs & Assigns for ever & Lastly I do hereby - nominate & Appoint Thomas Bolton of Charles Town Merchant and Andrew Sherkley of Berkeley County in the Province of South Carolina Overseer at Madom Triddetons Plantation Executors of this my Last Will & Testament hereby revoking disannulling & making Void all Other Wills Testaments by me ~~by me~~ heretofore made Ratifying Declaring & Confirming this to stand, & be for & as my Only Last Will & Testament In Witness whereof to this my Last Will & Testament - I have hereunto set my Hand & Seal this Twenty Seventh day of February in the Year of Our Lord One thousand Seven Hundred & Forty three in the Presence of the Subscribers Who by my request - have Signed their Names as Witnesses thereto - Sealed Delivered Pronounced Declared & acknowledged by the said Testator as his Last Will and Testament in Our Presence Who by his Request - have Signed Our Names as Witnesses therunto - This Will was proved before his Excellency the 12th day of February 1747 by the Oath of Elizabeth Bolton one of the Witnesses to the within Will At same time Qualified Thomas Bolton one of the Executors within named Recorded 12th February 1747
