1748 I Benjamin Baker of Berkeley County in the Province of South
Carolina Planter being very weak in body but of Perfect mind + memory
thanks be given unto God therefore Calling to mind the Mortality of my Body +
knowing that it is Appointed for all men once to die do make + ordain this
my Last Will + Testament That is to say Principally + first of all I do give
+ Recommend my Soul unto God that gave it; and my Body to the Earth to be
decently Buried at the Discretion of my Executors Nothing Dauiting but at the
general Resurrection I shall receive the same again by the Mighty power
of God. And as touching such worldly Estate wherewith it hath pleased God
to bless me in this Life I dispose of in the following manner + form
Inprimis my Will is that my funeral charges together with all others
of my Lawfull debts be fully Discharged + Paid Item I give + Bequeath
unto my beloved wife one best feather bed + bedding + Pavilion + all
her Wearing apparel + two Large Junks; and one horse named Terryary
+ Woman Saddle + Bridle Item I leave unto them in st^d wife full +
uninterrupted Leare Comfortably to Dwell on my Plantation on Ashley River
where I now live During her Widduhood yet so that my said Plantation
be not abused of which my Executors shall be judge Item as to the Rest of
my horses + cattle Houshold goods + Plantation Tools or all my other
Personal Estate my Will is that the same be Sold Excepting so many of them
as my Executor shall think fit and Convenient to keep for the use + Benefit of my
beloved Son John + Excepting a Negro Wench named Aphy & her two Children
which said three Slaves I do give + Bequeath unto my beloved wife
likewise my Will is that my Negro Girl named Aphy be with my wife

until my Little Son John shall become one year older than he now is Then
my will is that afterwards this st^d Girl Aphy shall be Either Sold or Left for
my Beloved Son John to whom I give and Bequeath her Just as my Executors shall
think fit Item I do give + Bequeath all the Rest of my Slaves not above mentioned
named Ducco, George, Robin, Abram, Maria, Diana, Mingo, Beach, Belinda +
Judy to my d^r Son John Baker and also my Tract of Land on Ashley River
containing ^{four hundred} (400) acres and do hereby leave + give my Executors a
full Discretionary Power either to sell these s^d Legacies of Lands + Slaves -
Bequeathed to my Son John + Put out ye money upon interest for him or keep them
in possession + use just as they shall think most Proper Item in case my said Son
John shall Die before he comes of age my will is that all my Estate given to him
shall be given to + become ye rights of his Son or Daughter lawfully begotten if
any such shall then subsist: But in case of a failure herein I do give and
Bequeath all the said Estate unto the heirs lawfully begotten of my several
Brothers William, Elihu + James Baker to be Equally Divided
between them and to prevent all misunderstandings + Disputes I do hereby
declare that this my Last Will + Testament Shall be construed + understood
according to the most Literal and Obvious meaning thereof. And I do hereby
Constitute + Ordain my Father in Law John Jenkins + my Brother Elihu
Baker to be Executors of this my Last Will + Testament utterly Disavowing
all former Wills + Testaments + declaring this + no other to be my Last Will +
Testament In witness whereof I have hereunto Set my Hand + Seal the
day + year above written

In the Name of God Amen I Elihu Baker Sen^r of Charles Town in the Province of South Carolina Planter; being sick and weak in Body but of sound mind memory and understanding praised be God for the same. Do make and Declare this my last Will & Testament, in manner following that is to say, First I will that all my just Debts & Funeral Expenses be duly paid & satisfied: Also I will give devise and bequeath unto my Son Isaac Ambrosus Baker All the Southermost moiety or half part of all that my Lott of Land on white point in Charles Town aforesaid whereon the Brick House is Built wherein I now dwell, together with the Kitchen & all Appurtenances thereunto belonging, to hold to him his Heirs & Assigns for ever & the Northernmost moiety or other half part of the said Lott, I give devise & bequeath unto my Son George Baker to hold to him his Heirs & Assigns for ever: And as to all and Singular the rest Residue & Remainder of my Estate Real & personal or of what nature & kind the same may be or wheresoever the same shall be found I give devise and Bequeath the same unto my Loving wife Elizabeth Baker, & my children; Isaac Ambrosus, George & Mary, to be equally shared and divided between them four Share & portion alike: And I will and desire that my wife during her widowhood, that is to say while she shall remain my Widow unmarried, have the sole Care & Management of the persons & Estates of my Children during their Minority & if she thinks fitter during that time, to dwell in the House I now reside and thereby further this and direct, That in Case any of my said Children shall happen to die before he or she attain the age of twenty one year or day of marriage the fourth share or portion of my Estate herein before given & bequeathed to such Child or Children so dying shall go to and be equally divided between my said wife & my surviving Children a Child fourt Share & portion alike. And to their Heirs & Assigns for ever, And I hereby nominate & appoint my said wife Elizabeth Executive & Henry Middleton Esq^r Executor of this my last Will & Testament hereby revoking all former and other Will & Wills by me at any time heretofore made Declaring this & no other to be my last Will & Testament.

Item I Give & Bequeath unto the three Children of my late deceased Brother Isaac Lewis that is to say to Mary Norman, the sum of Three hundred Pounds current Money of this Province; to Sedgwick Lewis other Three hundred Pounds like
