 Do make this my last Will and Testament in Manner following -  
 that is to say first I commend my Soul to Almighty God my Creator  
 hoping for a Joyfull Resurrection at the last Day through the Merits  
 of my Blessed Saviour Jesus Christ And my Body I commit  
 to the Earth to be decently Buried at the Discretion of my Executors  
 hereafter mentioned And as to all such worldly Estate with which  
 it had pleased God of his Goodness to bless me I give and dispose  
 thereof as follows In primitus I give and Bequeath unto my Beloved  
 Wife Mary Petty the Sum of one Hundred Pounds Item I give  
 and Bequeath unto my Son Henry Petty the Sum of one Hundred  
 Pounds to be paid him at his Age of Twenty One Years And I hereby -  
 direct that the said Sum of one Hundred Pounds shall be set out at  
 Interest in the name of my Executors hereafter mentioned and that such  
 Interest shall from time to time as it becomes due be paid to my said  
 Wife for and towards her Maintenance and Education But in Case my  
 said Son Henry Petty shall himselfe die before he attains his Age of  
 Twenty one years that then and in such Case I give and Devise the  
 said Sum of one Hundred Pounds to my Deare Beloved Daughter  
 Harriott Petty And I do direct and appoint the said Sum of one hundred  
 Pounds to be paid to my <sup>said</sup> Daughter at <sup>by Two Years</sup>  
 Item I give Devise <sup>the</sup> Estate of what  
 nature soever either in Possession Reversion Remainder  
 or Expectancy unto Samuel Crew of Westminster in the said County  
 of Middlesex Gentleman Henry Crank of Bishopgate Street London  
 Gentleman and George Green of Clements Inn in the said County of  
 Middlesex Gentleman and to their Heirs and Assigns upon this Special

Trust and Confidence that is to say that they the said Samuel Crew Henry  
 Crank and George Green or the Survivor of them or the Heir of such  
 Survivor shall as soon as may be after my Decease Sell and Dispose of  
 the same And the Money arising ~~by~~ <sup>from</sup> such Sale to pay them or the Survivor  
 of them or the Heir of such Survivor Pased out at Interest upon some  
 Government or other good Security in their names or in the name of the  
 Survivor of them or in the name of the Heir of such Survivor for the  
 Sole Use and Benefit of my <sup>dear</sup> Daughter Harriott Petty  
 and the Interest thereof to be applied <sup>towards</sup> her maintenance and  
 Education Item I give and bequeath to the said Samuel Crew Henry  
 Crank and George Green one Guinea each to buy a Ring Item I give  
 and bequeath to James Brune Surgeon one Guinea to Buy him a  
 Ring Item all the Residue and Remainder of my Goods Chattells  
 Debts due and owing to me, ready Money and all other my Personal  
 Estate whatsoever and wheresoever not hereinbefore Bequeathed I give  
 and Devise the same unto my said Daughter Harriott Petty and  
 I do hereby make the said Samuel Crew Henry Crank and George  
 Green Executors of this my Will and Trustees for and Guardians to  
 my Said Son and Daughter And my Will is that my said Trustees  
 shall with all the Speed they can after my Debts and Funeral  
 Expences are paid and discharged get in all the Residue of my  
 Personal Estate as given to my Daughter as aforesaid And the  
 Money arising therefrom place out at Interest upon some Government  
 or other good Securities in their names or in the name of the Su-  
 rivor of them but for the Sole Use of my said Daughter Harriott  
 Petty And the Interest that shall arise from the same my Will and  
 Desire is it shall likewise be applied by them the said Samuel Crew  
 Henry Crank and George Green for and towards the Maintenance Education  
 and Bringing up of my said Daughter Harriott Petty And I do hereby

Direc<sup>t</sup> and appoint that all money so given to my said Daughter Harriett Petty as aforsaid as well as what shall arise from the Sale of my real estate as from the Residue of my Personal Estate shall be paid to my said Daughter Harriett Petty by my Trustees at the Day of her Attaining the Age of Twenty Two Years and I do hereby Declare this to be my last Will and Testament hereby revoking all other Wills by me at any time heretofore made. It is my Will and desire that this paper or the Contents hereof might be annexed in way of a Codicil to my last Will and Testament that were made some months before my departure from England. The Copy of the st<sup>th</sup> Will is now in the hands of Mr George Seaman of this place. Item I give and bequeath unto my Son Henry Petty - One hundred pounds Sterling more than what I Bequeathed to him in my last Will, but if the said Henry should die before he's Twenty one Years of age I then Bequeath the said hundred Pounds to my wife Mary Petty of living but if my wife Mary should be deserted this life before the st<sup>th</sup> Henry becomes of age I then Bequeath this st<sup>th</sup> hundred pounds to my Daughter Harriett Petty. the Eleventh Day of November in the Twenty Second Year of the Reign of our Sovereign Lord George the Second by the Grace of God of Great Britain France and Ireland King Defender of the Faith + &c and in the Year of our Lord One Thousand Seven hundred and forty Eight. James Voulcuy of St Philips Parish Charles Town, in the said Province, Gen<sup>r</sup> being sick and weak in Body: But of Sound and disposing Mind and Memory (Blessed be God) and knowing that it is appointed for all men once to Die, do therefore make this my last Will and Testament; and hereby Revoke and Annul all former and other Wills and Testaments by me made and do declare this only to be and remain as and for my last Will and Testament. Principally, being sincerely sorry for all my sins and humbly begging pardon for the same, I recommend my Soul to God who gave it in and thro' the merits and merits and mediation of Jesus Christ my blessed Saviour and Redeemer, in whose Righteousness alone I trust for salvation. And my Body, at Death, I Commit to the Earth, to be Buried in a Christian like, decent and general manner, at the Discretion of my Executors hereinafter named: hoping for a glorious Resurrection to eternal life: And as for all my worldly Estate, Goods and Chattels, I Will and Ordain - that they shall be bestow'd and disposed of, in manner and form following; that is to say; First, I Will and Desire that all my just Debts and Funeral Expences shall be well and truly Paid and Defrayed in convenient Time, after my Decease. Item - Give Desire and Bequeath unto my will Beloved Wife Lydia Voulcuy, All my Household Goods, Plate Linen, Bedds, Tables, Chairs, Kitchen Utensils and other Household Furniture in my House, where I now live, One negro Slave named Jack
