In the Name of God Amen, I James Berrie of Colleton County & Province of South Carolina being weak & sick in body but of sound mind & memory thanks be to God & calling to mind the Mortality of my Body & knowing it is Appointed for all men once to die do make & Ordain this my last Will & Testament (that is to say) Principally & first of all I give and recommend my Soul into the Hands that gave it, & my body I recommend to the Earth to be Buried in a Christian like & decent Manner at the discretion of my Executors hereinafter mentioned & as touching such worldly Goods wherewithal it hath pleased God to Blef me in this life I give & Bequeath the same in Manner & form following Yrs:

Item, I will that all my just Debts & funeral Expenses be first Discharged & paid Item, the better to enable my Executors to discharge my just debts they are hereby Impowered to sell all or any part of my said Estate Real & Personal as they shall judge Necessary Immediately & as soon as they conveniently can, shall dispose of all my Real & personal Estate for the purpose after mentioned Yrs, the discharging of all my just debts and the remainder to be divided into four equal Shares one of which I give to my beloved wife Purchase Berrie & to my three children William Purchase and James Berrie each of them one Share to them & their Heirs for ever my Wifes Share to be paid after the discharge of the debts of my three Childrens shares off shall be put out to Interest, which rest or part of principal shall be (James Berrie) be Applied for <sup>all manner</sup>  
~~time missing~~ Education of my 2<sup>d</sup> Children in such a prudent manner think proper & the revision of their said Deferent Shd to them at the Age of Twenty One years or be married whil lastly I do hereby nominate & constitute appoint & Good Friends Ezekiel Branford Samuel Lowle Will & Thomas Sacheverell my whole & sole Executors of this my Last Will and Testament Herby Revoking Disallowing Disannulling & making void all every other former Will & Testaments Legacys & bequeathes by me made or bequeathed Ratifying & Confirming this & nother to be my last Will Testament In witness whereof I have hereunto set my Hand Seal this twenty seventh day of April in the Year of our Lord One Thousand Seven Hundred and forty Seven

This Will was proved by virtue of a Oidimus this 3<sup>rd</sup> day of December 1747 by the Oaths of George Mitchell & John Candy before James Bullock Esq; to him directed at same time Qualified

In The Name of God Amen, I Joseph Coke of Johns Island in Colleton County in the Province of South Carolina, Surgeon, being weak of Body but of Sound & Disposing Mind & Memory after Recommitting my Soul in the most serious manner to its Merciful Creator think proper to dispose of my Temporal Estate as follows Imprimis I give to my Exon and Executrix hereafter mentioned in Trust my six hundred Acres of Land on Salcacher River in South Carolina, to be sold in such manner as they shall think proper either at publick or private Sale as soon as they can and the Money apply'd as is herein After directed Item I Appoint & require that all my Horses, Cattle Household Goods, Books, Medicines & Surgical Instruments together with my Plantation & the Crops made this year be immediately sold and what is due to me by Bonds Notes or Book debts be Collected without loss of time and that the Money arising there from as well as from the sale of my Land above mentioned be apply'd to the payment of my just debts and funeral Expenses and what shall remain I give to my Sister Rebecca Coke Item I give & bequeath to my Sister Sarah Coke one Negro man Named Ben & his wife Calia & their two children Grace & Sam to her Heirs & Apions forever Item I give to my friend Thomas Smith Junr Merchant in Charles Town one Mourning Ring to be made for him at my expence of the Value of five Guineas with a Hand in Hand engraved thereon & this motto round it, Nec Morte Separabitur. Item I give and Bequeath to my sister Rebecca Coke all the residue of my Estate both Real & personal Wherever it may be found On condition that she maintain & support my Father Bently Coke in good wholesome sufficient & necessary meat drink Washing Lodging and Apparel for and during the term of his natural life Item I appoint my friend Thomas <sup>the</sup> aforesaid Executrix & my Sister Rebecca Coke Executrix of this my last Will & Testament & do hereby disanull & make void all former Wills & Testaments by me heretofore made or Appointed In Witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand & Seal this Twenty Seventh day of November in the Year of our Lord One Thousand Seven Hundred and forty Seven
