This will was proved before his Excellency the Governor the 11th of January 1750 by the oath of the Noble John Cleland Esq by Varsity of hands & at the same time John Bassett of the Esqrs. thereunto Qualified

In the name of God Amen the thirteenth day November in the year of our Lord 1750 I John Moor of Williamsburgh Lewis County South Carolina Planter being very sick & weak in Body but of Perfect mind & memory thanks be Given unto God therefore Calling unto mind the mortality of my body and knowing that it is Appointed for all men once that is to say Principally and first of all I Give & Recommend my soul into the hands of God that gave it and for my Body I Recommend it to the Earth to be buried in a Christianlike and Decent manner at the discretion of my Executors nothing but at the General Resurrection I shall receive the same again by the Power of God and as touching such worldly Estate wherewith it hath Pleased God to provide and Dispose of the same

and only let this my last will and Testament all to be at their care and ordering as hereafter follows that is

To say untill my Loving Son John Moor doth come to the age and year of sixteen that then he may if he thinks proper what he may come in as Exors with the said William Ferguson & John Porter according to their conduct as he is the youngest that he will in all things take their advice Item I Bequest to my daughter Margaret Moor all the Cattle & horses that formerly was bealed & named as hers & also to my son John Moor all the Cattle & his horse that was named to him & twenty pounds currency to be paid to him when there is a division made of the whole Estate and I allow Joseph Moor my son to have what Cattle that was named to him & forty Pounds when the Estate is divided Item I Give & Allow to my youngest son Samuel Moor all what was formerly bealed his of the Cattle & fifty pounds when Estate is divided & all my Lands I allow to be divided between my three sons each alike and the land best that was bealed in the Plantation I allow to Joseph Moor my son & all the Remainder of my Estate to be divided into four equal shares when my youngest son Samuel Moor comes to the age of sixteen years & I do hereby utterly Revoke & Annul all former wills & legacies & Exors. by me in any wise named in witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand & Seal the day and year above written Signed Sealed Published & Delivered
