One Thousand Pounds of Current Money to be drawn out of the Estate Accrdg
to Appraisement I Give unto my Nephew John Rae a Negro boy named
Sambo a Shoe maker unto my Niece Frances Rae I Give a Negro boy named
Shoemaker also my neices Rachel and Ann Rae I Give unto each
of them a Little Regis to the discretion of those I shall after nominate
to make the Division of my Estate I also Give unto Walter Martins two
children fifteen Cows & Calves and unto W^m & Francis Goddard each of them a horse
or mow to be by them chosen next after my wife all the rest & Residue of my
Estate of my Estate I Give and Bequeath unto my Loving Brothers Francis
& Timothy Britton Desiring that they two gether with my Brother Joseph
may see my just Debts paid and make a Division of the Residue as I have Desir'd
and in my Corps decently Interred and I do Allow this to be my Last will & Testament

Plantation where I now live with my children Andrew Jean Mary Joseph
& Barbara Greal and live together till such times that the youngest
child comes of age & then I Order all my Goods & Chattels Equally to

For to be Divided Amongst my wife and five Children Only my Plantation
I order to my Son Andrew when there can be a Settlement made when the Youngest
is at age the said Andrew paying to his Brother Joseph & Sisters Two Hundred
Pounds Currency & in case Andrew dies before of age or has Lawfull issue I order my
Son Joseph to Posses the Plantation on the a^o terms that Andrew was to have it
but in Case my son Andrew when he comes of age thinks proper for to alter his
Condition & part from the family I order him an Equal Divedent of what is
Left by me with whatsoever Addition they may make till it and in Case
my wife has mind to Alter her Condition by marriage I allow her an Equal
part with my Children for to be given her at her marriage or when she thinks
proper to demand it I Constitute my Beloved wife Barbara Greal whilst in
her Widuchhood and Samuel Greal and Arthur Baxdale far to be Executrix of
this my Last will and Testament and I do hereby Ratify & Confirm this and none
other to be my Last will & Testament in witness whereof I have hereunto set my
hand & Seal this Second Day of September one Thousand seven hundred and
forty nine Published Pronounced & Declared by Joseph Greal to be his last

Lawfull Debts be paid out of my whole Estate by my Executrix & Executor

Boone four negro men by name Scipio, ~~Sam~~ Sirius, Duke & Somerset
three women by name Molatto Hester old Sarah Little Daffey Three Boys
by name Little Dick Little Scipio & Buffee Two Girls by name Molatto
Phillis Black Phillis Item and their Increase one third part of all my house
hold goods the plate Excepted one third part of all the stock on this Plantation to
her and her heirs forever I give her the liberty of living in this house & the use of the
land and the use of my Plate during her widowhood & no Longer.
Item I Give and Bequeath unto my said Son Thomas Boone all that tract or
parcel of Land wherein he now lies both on the main & Island Containing 856
Acres
